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

The minutes of the meeting of November 22 were approved.

he following announcements were made:

1) By the President:

- (a) Introduction of Joseph Kinsey Howard, author of "Montana, High, Wide, and Handsome", member of the staff of "Montana Study".
- (b) Faculty attendance at University functions is desirable; the dramatic, musical and other amateur productions are of high quality and worthwhile. Attendance by members of the faculty encourages amateurs.
- (c) Prompt filling tout of service reports for the winter quarter is necessary.
- (d) Recent recommendations of the State Board of Education based on proposals of the Commission on Higher Education include (1) unification of budgetary and educational procedures (but not physical consolidation), and (2) clarification of powers of the State Board of Education.

(2) By the Secretary (Business Manager):

- (a) Members of the faculty, as well as all other employees of the State University, are covered by state industrial accident insurance.
- (b) State laws and regulations provide for inventories of all equipment of the University, which must be accounted for, and all members of the staff share in responsibility for equipment in their custody.
- (c) Request for release of equipment, particularly files, not in essential use, was renewed; and assistance in arrangement and disposal of old records was offered.

(3) By Dean Jesse:

Grade Reports for Fall Quarter are due in the Registrar's Office not later than 4:00 p.m., Tuesday, December 26.

(4) By Dr. Browman, Chairman Schedule Committee:

Examination questions should be obtained from the Clerical Service Division on the day of examinations; change of rooms for examinations should be reported to the Committee (Dr. Browman or Miss Wilhelm), and changes of time of examinations may not be made without prior notice and approval.

(5) Professor Bennett, Chairman War Bonds Committee, reported an estimate of

\$15,000 purchases of Sixth War Bonds by employees of the University that the monthly payrolls (November) were approximately \$50,000 of which approximately \$5,000 was withheld for federal income tax. Attention to reports to the Committee of purchases was requested in order to enable the Committee to respond to requests for information concerning purchases of War Bonds by employees of the University.

- (6) Care in salvaging waste paper was urged by Mr. Swearingen, Chairman Committee on Defense roblems.
- (7) On the suggestion of Professor Freeman, Chairman Committee on Public Exercises a motion by Merriam seconded by Spaulding, that a regular period for Convocation (with shortened morning class periods of 37 minutes each) be restored next quarter, was approved by vote of the faculty.

Professor Freeman requested suggestions for celebration of Charter Day.

(8) By Dr. Merrill, Coordinator ASTRP:

Suggestions concerning bids on government property used by ASTRP should be made to Dr. Merrill or Mr. Francis.
