### **HABITAT FOR HUMANITY TO DEDICATE GRIZ HOUSE ON SUNDAY**

#### **MISSOULA –**

A new Habitat for Humanity house that will be christened in Missoula on Sunday will have a little Grizzly flavor about it.

Members of The University of Montana community pitched in over the past several months to help build the house on the southwest corner of South Fourth Street West and Garfield Street.

“The house that Griz built,” which will soon be home to the seven-member Kicking Woman family of Missoula, will be dedicated Sunday, Dec. 7, at 2 p.m. The public is invited to attend the dedication.

“We wanted to develop a partnership and make new friends at the University,” said Dave Crismon, executive director of Habitat for Humanity Missoula. “Our goal was to have the whole house built by University of Montana students, staff and faculty.”

While other community members ended up lending a hand, Crismon said UM was well represented during the construction of the 1,200-foot, four-bedroom house.

“This is a great example of how Habitat for Humanity can work in partnership with the UM community,” Crismon said.
