
- d. Dr. Jesse, Chairman, submitted the following recommendation of the Curriculum Committee to the faculty:

That the restricted elective requirement in foreign languages be modified in such a way that the specific requirement be left to each department and those in charge of each major in the college of arts and sciences. If the requirement is to be passed by a test showing reading knowledge of the foreign language, this test is to be given at the level corresponding to four quarters of instruction.
