ENVIRONMENTAL LAW PIONEER TO SPEAK AT UM

MISSOULA —

A pioneer in the field of environmental law, Professor David S. Schoenbrod, will deliver a speech titled "Saving Our Environment from Washington" at The University of Montana School of Law on Wednesday, Oct. 26.

He will speak at 5 p.m. at the Castles Center in the Jameson Law Library, located in the Law Building. A complimentary reception honoring Schoenbrod will follow the event.

Schoenbrod is a professor at the New York Law School and an adjunct scholar at the Cato Institute. His recent scholarship focuses on government officials and public interest advocates exercising power in ways that evade accountability to voters.

In addition to publishing in scholarly journals and contributing to the editorial pages of the Wall Street Journal, New York Times and other newspapers, Schoenbrod is the author of "Power without Responsibility: How Congress Abuses the People through Delegation" and the co-author of "Democracy by Decree: What Happens When Courts Run Government."

As a staff attorney for the Natural Resources Defense Council during the 1970s, Schoenbrod helped lead the charge to get lead out of gasoline, dramatically helping to reduce the amount of the brain-damaging contaminant in the air.

Schoenbrod's visit is hosted by the UM chapter of the Federalist Society for Law and Public Policy Studies, a national network of legal scholars that examines the balance between the rights and powers of the federal government and the individual states.

The Federalist Society was founded on the principles that the state exists to preserve freedom, that the separation of governmental powers is central to our Constitution, and that it is emphatically the province and duty of the judiciary to say what the law is, not what it should be. The organization concentrates its analytic efforts on the relationship between the law and the political process, without regard to partisan political affiliation.
