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CENTRAL BOARD

November 13, 1963

The meeting was called to order by President Dick Jones at 7:30 p.m. in the College Inn.

Jones reported that there would be a sneak preview of "McClintock" at the Wilma Theatre Thursday, Nov. 14, 7:00 p.m.

Planning Board--Linda Phillips, chairman.

1. Phillips reported that a new committee, Student Life Committee, has been set up within Planning Board. This committee will deal with complaints and suggestions of the students regarding the social regulations on campus.
2. Phillips read Planning Board's recommendations that CB recommend the Radio-TV School's proposal for an FM Radio Station to the Board of Directors of the Special Reserve Fund. Schwanke pointed out that the Board of Directors was not going to spend any of the funds until there was a \$10,000 surplus. Dan Bieri, a student member of the Board of Directors, said that it would have to be decided at the December meeting. The Board is also considering the United Students Aid Program and the Friends of the Library as possible fields of donation. MacDonald moved that CB recommend to the directors of the Reserve Fund the proposal for an FM Station but after discussion withdrew the motion in favor of another motion. Mr. Phillip Hess said that KMSU, if financed, would be a non-commercial and educational station with a 10 watt power. Ross stated that an FM Station would be an addition to the campus and benefit the students. Hess said that there would be depth reporting, news, and special events of the campus on the station. Bieri asked if the station could possibly be financed through ASMSU funds. Phillips answered that since the Special Reserve Fund is for a project that would benefit the students, Planning Board recommended the proposal for an FM Radio Station be financed by the Reserve Fund. Richard moved that CB recommend the proposal for an FM Radio Station from Planning Board to the Board of Directors of the Special Reserve Fund. MacDonald seconded. Motion defeated (5-10-1) with Stone, Behan, Turner, Richard and MacDonald for; Cole, Schwanke, Ross, Crump, Speck, Asselstine, Ulmer, Taylor, Kositzky, and Bowler against; and Watts abstaining. COLE MOVED THAT CENTRAL BOARD RECOMMEND THAT THE IDEA OF AN FM RADIO STATION BE PLACED AMONG THE PROJECTS WHICH THE TRUSTEES OF THE SPECIAL RESERVE FUND WILL BE CONSIDERING IN THE FUTURE. SECONDED BY SCHWANKE. MOTION PASSED (13-0-3) WITH SCHWANKE, COLE, BOWLER, ROSS, ULMER, BEHAN, CRUMP, TAYLOR, WATTS, STONE, RICHARD, KOSITZKY, ASSELSTINE FOR AND TURNER, SPECK AND MACDONALD ABSTAINING.

Publications Board--Phil Miller, chairman.

Miller gave Pub Board's recommendation that Dixie Blaszek, Peggy Short, and Mignon Redfield be appointed as Associate Editors of the Sentinel. ROSS MOVED THAT CENTRAL BOARD ACCEPT PUBLICATION BOARD'S RECOMMENDATION THAT DIXIE BLASZEK, PEGGY SHORT, AND MIGNON REDFIELD BE APPOINTED ASSOCIATE EDITORS OF THE THE SENTINEL. SECONDED BY CRUMP. MOTION PASSED (14-0-2) WITH SCHWANKE AND COLE ABSTAINING. Miller also stated that Pub Board disclaims any responsibility for any publication except Kairin, M-Book, the Sentinel and Venture unless this publication has its budget approved by ASMSU's Budget & Finance Comm. or is referred to Pub Board by the dean's office. This resolution was passed at Pub Board in response to a request from Dean Cogswell. Dean Cogswell asked the committee to make a statement of policy concerning the solicitation of advertising by minor publications on campus.

Vice President's Report

The personnel of the ASMSU committees will be reported at the next CB meeting.

President's Report

Jones appointed Crump to Budget & Finance Comm. and Taylor and Behan to Planning Board. Also the World University Service (WUS) Representative was on campus this week.

Old Business

Jones read the letter from Sen. Mansfield and Mr. Surrey of the Treasury Department regarding the proposed tax exemptions before Congress. MacDONALD MOVED THAT JONES WRITE TO SEN. MANSFIELD STATING THE CHANGES MENTIONED BY MR. SURREY BE A MINIMUM OF TAX REFORMS DESIRED BY CENTRAL BOARD. SECONDED BY STECK. MOTION PASSED (10-3-2) WITH DOWLER, SCHWANKE, COLE, WATTS, MacDONALD, BEHAN, ULMER, ASSELSTINE, KOSITZKY, AND RICHARD FOR; ROSS, CRUMP, AND STONE AGAINST; AND TURNER AND TAYLOR ABSTAINING.

Jones reported that the CB resolution opposing the granting of a Liberal Arts degree to Eastern Montana College of Education was sent to all members of the Board of Regents and Governor Babcock. Jones is going to the Board of Regents meeting Nov. 14 to answer any questions and deliver the petitions signed by students of MSU approving the resolution.

Tom Behan, freshman delegate, stated that he would like to go on record in support of Central Board's proposal to oppose a liberal arts degree of EMCE. He abstained from voting on the resolution until he could investigate both sides of the question and draw his own conclusions.

Student Union

Schwanke reported that the Student Union Executive Board would like to send some of the Program Council and Central Board members to Idaho State and Washington State University to see their student unions. He also said that the Executive Board wondered if CB could finance their delegates who might go. Any allocation of money would have to be passed by Budget & Finance first, however, Schwanke stated.

New Business

Jones reported that there would be a meeting Nov. 22 at 4:00 p.m. with Dean Bolen and downtown businessmen to plan for future cultural activities involving cooperation between the University and the town of Missoula. Jones, Dowler, and Speck will attend from Central Board.

Traditions Board--Jim Erickson, chairman.

Erickson reminded CB of "Varsity Day," Tuesday, November 19. There will be an indoor band concert presented by the University Marching Band. Erickson also asked that CB accept his resignation as chairman of Traditions Board because he does not have the time due to his student teaching. He will remain as chairman until a new chairman is appointed. ULMER MOVED THAT CENTRAL BOARD ACCEPT WITH REGRET JIM ERICKSON'S RESIGNATION AS CHAIRMAN OF TRADITIONS BOARD. SECONDED BY SCHWANKE. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.
