Montana pharmacists will get the latest word on nuclear-age developments in their profession at the second annual Pharmacy Postgraduate Seminar at Montana State University April 29, according to Dean Robert L. Van Horne of the MSU School of Pharmacy.

The seminar is offered as a public service by the MSU School of Pharmacy in cooperation with the Montana State Pharmaceutical Association, the dean said. Members of the MSU pharmacy faculty will staff the seminar, which will be in session April 29 from 9 a. m. to 5 p. m.

Speakers and their topics are Dr. Charles W. Roscoe, "Radiation"; Dr. Frank A. Pettinato, "Medicinal Applications of Radioisotopes"; Dr. Gordon H. Bryan, "Therapy for Radiation Sickness and Survival"; Dr. Van Horne, "Responsibilities of the Pharmacist in the Nuclear Age," and Dr. John L. Wailes, "Oral Dosage Forms."

Pharmacists and interns will pay a \$2 registration fee to help defray costs of the seminar, but their wives or husbands may attend without charge, Dean Van Horne said. Pharmacists planning to come are asked to notify the Seminar Committee, School of Pharmacy, Montana State University, Missoula.
