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Central Board Minutes
November 7, 1962

The meeting was called to order by President Ed Whitelaw in the Silver Bow Room. Corrections to the minutes of October 31 were the correction of the spelling of "Ulrich" on page 1, and the addition to the election report of the following: 449 Freshmen voted in the General Election on October 31, and 449 signed the registry; 48 Juniors voted and 48 signed the book. The total number voting in the election was 497.

Publications Board

Matge Dightman reported that the Board wished to recommend Mary Lou Cushman for Venture Editor, Doug Griffith for Business Manager, and for Advisor, James Allen who won over Dr. Snow 4-3. Fred McGlynn stated that Laulette Hansen had also submitted an application for the position of editor but had been unable to find the interviewing committee on the correct day. Robinson said that he had received Miss Hansen's application about the first week of school. Dightman read the qualifications of the two girls. Cushman had been business manager for the Venture, was an English and Journalism major and had an approximate 3.6 grade average. Hansen, a Philosophy major had served the Preface magazine of Goucher College in Boston as the Poetry Editor and had worked two quarters on the Venture. Both girls are Juniors. Marshall Dennis asked whether another interview might be arranged. Robinson said that out of due fairness to both candidates, Hansen should be interviewed. Browman said he thought that both girls had had equal opportunity and that Hansen hadn't demonstrated her interest; he said that he felt that candidate might be pushed by certain persons. BROWMAN MOVED THAT CENTRAL BOARD ACCEPT ALL THE CANDIDATES RECOMMENDED BY THE PUBLICATIONS BOARD. SECONDED BY FULLER. MOTION PASSED 12-4 WITH ROBINSON, VINOCUR, DENNIS, AND JOHNSON OPPOSED.

NEW CB MEMBERS

Whitelaw had each of the newly elected members introduce himself. Introduced were Brett Asselstine, Great Falls, with a 2 year term, Bob Ulvedal, Spokane, with a 1 year term, Jim Schultz, Glendive, with a one year term and Marshall Dennis, Lancaster, Calif., with a one year term.

Planning Board

Chairman Rick Jones announced that in one of the brainstorming sessions of the committee, it was suggested that we think about having a bomb shelter in the new Student Union building; Jones said the main reason for this suggestion was that possibly federal funds could be procured "to help build a new College Inn". Jones and Whitelaw met with the Board of Directors of the Chamber of Commerce at their luncheon November 7. Jones said they seemed very willing to discuss student grievances, etc. but wanted more in the way of specific examples. Jones said that after we are given the results of the Marketing School survey (to determine how much money students spend in Missoula, etc.) we will look into

forming a committee to funnel complaints, as was suggested by Mr. James Garus of the Retail Trade Commission.

Budget and Finance

BROWMAN MOVED THAT CENTRAL BOARD ALLOCATE \$352 TO THE WRESTLING CLUB FOR THEIR MEETS. SECONDED BY SDHIANKE. Browman said the club will host five meets here and travel for another 5. The admission to the home events will probably take care of the expense here, but money for lodging, mileage, and meals is needed for the out-of-town events. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Traditions Board

Erickson gave Whitelaw the picture of 1961-62 ASMSU President Denis Adams; this picture will hang in the ASMSU office with the other ones. Erickson showed a sample of the posters designed for the Bozeman game by Les Hankinson and Gene Budke. Whitelaw mentioned that some of the stickers distributed by the Athletic Department had been stuck on cars without the knowledge of the owners. Erickson announced that the Victory Bell would not be brought to the field until the third quarter of the game. Friday at 6:30 a Pep Rally and Snake Dance will be held, beginning at the corner of the Higgins Avenue school.

Special Events

Marshall Dennis stated that Stacy Swor has written to the Montana Woolgrowers on behalf of the Special Events Committee stating that they will be willing to handle the arrangements for the Miss Wool Pageant. Swor also included temporary plans for the event and a letter from Miss Ann Volhowe, the present Miss Wool. Dennis stated that in his financial statement of the Louis Armstrong Concert he neglected to include the cost of the tickets, \$68.14, and of the piano rental, \$10; after these costs, the total profit for the concert was \$1,922.71.

Student Information Committee

Cole stated that the committee had the idea of establishing a bulletin board in the Student Union which would list the part-time jobs available in the Missoula area; this would probably be done through Student Union. Mr. Love, who is in charge of student employment is in favor of this.

State-wide Convention

Spike Fuller reported that letters had been sent to the 9 colleges in the state and to the 2 Junior colleges concerning the coming convention.

Store Board

Dr. Vinocur asked whether any official notification of their reappointment as Board of Trustee members had been sent to Shallenburger and Freeman and asked that this be done. Whitelaw stated that he had told Briggs but would also contact the two men themselves.

Student Union

Whitelaw stated that the Executive Planning Committee was setting up a series of meetings with living groups and clubs to discuss the proposed Student Union. Also, at 9:00 P.M. November 15, the Sophomore

class will hold a meeting and open discussion of the Student Union. Jerry Van Sickle, Dave Browman, and Ed Whitelaw will be on hand to discuss and answer questions. (Browman will no doubt ask a few, too.)

Sentinels

Alice MacDonald asked when the Sentinels were to arrive. Browman answered that they would be here Saturday, Nov. 10 and would be distributed as soon as possible. He stated that the delay was due to our failure to specify a definite date for the Sentinels to be finished; next year's will have a deadline set.

Travel Coordinator

Whitelaw announced that the Student-Faculty Committee specifies a need for a student Travel Coordinator to meet with all the groups we send on tour and plan their destinations so that there will be no duplication or concentration in one area of the state. This person is needed by next week.

Appointments

At the request of Alice MacDonald, Brett Asselstine was appointed to the Past History Committee. Cole requested that Jim Schultz and Bob Ulvedal be put on the Student Information Committee; this was also done.
