HELENA STUDENTS RECEIVE SCHOLARSHIPS FROM UM

MISSOULA—

Eighteen **Helena** students have been awarded scholarships from The University of Montana.

Adam Clinch received an \$8,000 Haynes Foundation Scholarship. A 2007 graduate of Capital High School, he is the son of Edward Clinch and Traci Chisholm-Clinch of Helena.

Jack and Isabel Haynes, who owned and managed several Yellowstone Park photo shops, established the scholarship fund in 1960.

Four students received Bonhomme scholarships. Samantha Schorzman, a 2006 graduate of Helena High School, was awarded \$2,000. She is majoring in political science at UM. Her parents are Kim Staley and Jeff Peterson of Helena.

Three students — Elizabeth Cronin, Molly Sherlock and Sam White — each received \$1,000 scholarships. Cronin is a 2003 graduate of Capital High School and a UM senior majoring in anthropology and drama. She also won a \$500 Alexander and Virginia Dean Scholarship. Her parents are Jan and Mike Cronin of Helena.

Sherlock, a 2005 graduate of Capital High School, is a UM junior majoring in geography and the daughter of Melissa and Jeff Sherlock of Helena. White, a 2005 graduate of

Capital High School, is a UM junior majoring in music performance. He is the son of Jim and Shelley White.

The Bonhomme Scholarship Fund was established in 2001 by the estate of Peter and Elvi Bonhomme of Big Timber. The Alexander and Virginia Dixon Dean Scholarship, established in 1975, honors Alexander Dean, a professor of theatre at UM in the 1920s and his wife, Virginia, a 1917 UM graduate who taught economics and history at the University.

Two students — Bethany Stanbery and Jennifer Hubber — received Lulu L. Miles/Gamer Shoe Co. Memorial scholarships.

Stanbery received a \$1,500 scholarship. A 2003 graduate of Capital High School, she is a senior majoring in pre-physical therapy. Her parents are Alan and Catherine Stanbery of Helena.

Hubber received a \$750 scholarship. A 2003 graduate of Helena High School, she is a UM senior majoring in zoology and microbiology and the daughter of Margaret Hubber of Helena.

The scholarship was established in 1971 through the estate of Lulu Miles, who came to Helena as a bride in 1906, and by funds from the Fredrick Gamer family

Kaelyn Kelly received a \$1,500 A.M. Hammond Scholarship. A 2007 graduate of Capital High School, she is a UM freshman majoring in journalism. Her parents are Timothy and Sarah Kelly of Helena.

The A.B. and Florence Hammond Scholarship was established in 1957 by Mrs. Frank B. King in memory of her father and mother. The Hammonds were one of the founding families of Missoula, and Missoula's Hotel Florence was named after Florence Hammond.

Karlee Amestoy received a \$1,500 Stanley Reinhaus Foundation Scholarship. A 2001 graduate of Capital High School, she is pursuing a doctorate degree in pharmacy at UM. Her parents are Patti and Gary Amestoy of Helena.

Reinhaus established the Stanley Reinhaus Foundation Scholarship in 1996.

Joel Tatz-Morey received a \$1,000 William Enderlein Scholarship. A 2007 graduate of Helena High School, he is a UM freshman majoring in environmental studies and the son of David Morey and Janet Tatz of Helena.

The William Enderlein Scholarship was established in 1997 through the estates of Philip and Esther Enderlein in memory of their son. Esther received a home economics degree at UM in 1931. Philip was a longtime Montana Power Co. employee.

Two students — Maghan Strachan and Suzanna Simmons — received \$1,000 UM License Plate Scholarships. Both are 2007 graduates of Helena High School. Strachan is a UM freshman and the daughter of Ken and Gayleen Strachan of Helena. Simmons is a UM freshman majoring in pre-med and the daughter of Ed and Linda Simmons of Helena.

A portion of the cost to purchase Montana's UM license plates makes the License Plate scholarships possible through the University's general scholarship fund.

Ashley Zuelke received a \$1,000 Brian L. Rygg Scholarship. A graduate of Capital High School, she is a UM sophomore majoring in journalism and political science. Her parents are Mary Ann Barbie-Rice and Gordon Zuelke of Helena.

Kim Cosgrove received a \$1,000 Ted Higenstuhler Scholarship. A 2000 graduate of Capital High School, Cosgrove is a graduate student in journalism at UM. Her parents are

Terry and Jan Cosgrove of Helena.

The Ted Hilgenstuhler Journalism Support Fund was established by Hilgenstuhler, a retired journalist and 1950 graduate of UM's journalism school.

Sarah Dargan received a \$1,000 Washington Foundation Scholarship. A UM senior majoring in fine arts/ceramics, she is the daughter of Ramie and Jennifer Dargan of Helena. The scholarship fund was established in 1994 by the Dennis and Phyllis Washington Foundation.

Ashley Marie Griffith received a \$1,000 Bill Kliber Memorial Scholarship. A 2005 graduate of Capital High School, she is a UM junior majoring in dance and the daughter of Earl and Dorothy Griffith of Helena.

The Bill Kliber Memorial Scholarship was established in 2000 by the School of Fine Arts Advisory Council in memory of Kilber, an ardent supporter of the arts on campus.

Lela Rae O'Bryant received two scholarships — a \$400 Odyssey of the Stars Scholarship and a \$350 Mary Cardell Moore and Robert and Florence Cardell Memorial Scholarship. A 2005 graduate of Helena High School, she is a UM junior majoring in drama. Her parents are Monty and Cynthia O'Bryant of Helena.

The Odyssey of the Stars scholarship is funded by the annual event that showcases the University's alumni who have gone on to successful careers in the arts and UM School of Fine Arts students. The Mary Cardell Moore and Robert and Florence Cardell Memorial Scholarship was established in 1999 by the estate of Mary Cardell Moore, a 1930 graduate of UM.

Tim Larson received a \$400 Concessions Scholarship. A 2005 graduate of Helena High
