EUREKA STUDENTS RECEIVE SCHOLARSHIPS FROM UM

MISSOULA—

Three students from **Eureka** have been awarded scholarships from The University of Montana.

Natalie Rae Utter received a \$6,000 Louis V. Dubay Scholarship. She is a 2007 graduate of Lincoln County High School and the daughter of Mark Utter and Selena Collins of Eureka.

The Louis V. Dubay Scholarship was established from the estate of Dubay, a longtime Missoula resident.

Michael Volsky received a \$1,600 Long Brothers' Scholarship. A 2007 graduate of Lincoln County High School, he is a UM freshman majoring in music performance and the son of William and Elena Sutley of Eureka.
