The conference, which will bring together more than 100 college student AmeriCorps members, AmeriCorps VISTA members and college student leaders from across the state, will be held on the Montana State University-Billings campus.

The three-day event will feature training on volunteer recruitment, project planning and engaging the campus community, needs assessment, resource development and time management. All sessions are designed to help students address their community and campus needs effectively.

The keynote speech will take place Saturday, Sept. 22, at 8:30 a.m. Speaking is Janine Pease, vice president for Native American Affairs at Rocky Mountain College. The lecture is open to the public.
