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### Documents from the October 5, 1960 meeting of the Associated Students of the University of Montana (ASUM)

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Central Board Minutes  
October 5, 1960

Absent: Lee, Carlson.

The meeting was called to order by President Paul Ulrich in the Silver Bow Room. The minutes were corrected to read, page 1, from the 1959-60 surplus of the general fund.

Ulrich read a letter from Max Pinegar from Brigham Young University inviting the Central Board officers to their Homecoming October 12-15.

BUDGET & FINANCE

Bon reported that Budget and Finance would like to appoint a student member of their committee to the Student Loan Committee. This committee has been appropriated 3.1% of the total ASMSU Budget or \$2000. The maximum amount of any loan is \$100. Bon recommended Diane Davis to serve in this capacity, and moved that Central Board appoint her. Motion seconded by Johnson; carried unanimously.

VICE PRESIDENT

~~Student Union~~ Datsopoulos reported that the Student Union will have a movie Friday night. The Swimming Pool will be open to the public Saturday afternoon and evening. Five student members and one faculty member of the committee will be attending the convention in Davis, California.

The College Inn made \$15 profit during the past week. Contact has been made with the married students concerning recreations for them.

Activities--The Homecoming Dance netted \$500 profit. As soon as the various committees under Activities Board are organized the program will be in full swing.

Browman inquired as to who will be paying for the Student Union trip to California. Ulrich answered that the Student Union has their own funds and has budgeted for this expense.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Carol Cooper reported that Eva Neisser, Kathy Doll, Joe Dietrich, and she have been doing study on the various countries of our foreign students. These persons also made attempts to get to know as many students as possible before the first foreign student meeting. Sunday of Orientation Week, Dr. Gilbert took charge of their first meeting. These students mentioned also made themselves

to the foreign students for questioning and arranged for American students to go through registration with a foreign student. Cooper reported that her group has not met yet as a committee but will be represented at Cosmopolitan Club and will work more closely with that group this year. She extended an invitation to Central Board members to attend Cosmopolitan Club.

Friends of the Library—Ulrich read a report from Carlson that he and Johnson had attended the meeting last Friday, Sept. 30. Directors were elected and a temporary statement of organization was approved as official. Farrington asked where this group obtains its funds. Ulrich said that the officers are not official members of the University and the organization gets its funds through gifts and donations.

Athletic Committee—Ulrich reported that a list of athletic scholarships had been approved. 45 football scholarships, 13 basketball and 18 for other sports were approved. These include all athletes who are receiving any help; many of said scholarships are only partial.

Commencement Committee—Johnson reported that this committee met Tuesday, October 4. They discussed having seniors attend the last week of classes with Commencement at the end of Final Week. Teachers dislike the disruption of having students drop out the last week. The committee would like the advice of Central Board on this subject.

Ulrich said that tradition of the Lantern Parade and other such activities would be gone if graduation would be delayed until after final week. Johnson said the committee would hope that many students would stay for such activities. Morris asked why this hasn't been done in the past. Cogswell answered that the clerical problem of clearing the seniors for graduation has developed the present system. Johnson said that if the revision goes through that grades would have to be turned in on Friday before final week and maybe the whole commencement program would be compressed.

Cogswell said that this is no new problem, that the faculty has discussed this many times.

Ulrich decided to hold decisions for one week to give the delegates a chance to think about the problem. In the meantime each delegate will be supplied with a letter from Dr. Browman and Dr. Brunson upon the subject.

#### NEW BUSINESS

200 tickets will be available "free gratis" after Friday afternoon at the Lodge desk to the Misscula Civic Concert Series. The group in charge of the Series has given these tickets to the students in



return for help and support given them.

Ulrich asked that if a delegate has a topic for the agenda for future meetings that he talk to him or to one of the officers or to place ideas on the bulletin board outside the ASMSU office at least by Tues. noon before the next meeting. This is so that the Kaimin will be able to print the agenda for coming meetings.

Sharon Dodge will be asking delegates and other interested persons to write columns for the Word of the Week in the Kaimin. Dodge said that she was open to any ideas delegates may have for her.

A future topic for business will be the process by which the Model UN Delegates will be chosen for this year.

Ulrich announced that dates would have to be approved for the election of freshman delegates to Central Board. Datsopoulos suggested that petitions be issued October 13, validated by Central Board at the Oct. 19 meeting, primary elections to be October 27, and general elections to be November 3. Campaigning will begin upon publications of the names of candidates in the Kaimin. Cogswell asked who will be allowed to vote for these candidates. Ulrich said that anyone whose name appears of the freshman roster as prepared by the Registrar will be allowed to vote.

Whitelaw moved the acceptance of the dates proposed. Seconded by Datsopoulos, and carried unanimously.

Meeting dates have been set for the quarter for Wednesday afternoons at 4:00.

Colness suggested that when the Homecoming Theme for next years floats is set that the Missoula Alumni committee could use some more imagination. He thought that themes such as Disney Land or Broadway Hits could provide more impressive floats. Romstad agreed with the thought that the central theme around which Homecoming has been based for many years has been used up. Agen suggested that Central Board use the Alumni Relations committee to recommend to the Alumni the use of better themes.

Agen expressed a need for Central Board's approval of a Public Relations Area expenditure of \$88.05 for a filing cabinet and a typewriter, for use in the office set up for this department in the Fine Arts building, second floor. He said that last year's committee had nearly \$1000 surplus and that he would like to take the money from this. Stone said this should be referred to



Budget & Finance Committee. Agen said that he needed approval now so that his committees might begin work. Datsopoulos moved that Central Board allow Agen to purchase his said materials. Ulvila seconded. Motion carried 11-0, with Bon opposed.

Stone said that since he was the faculty adviser at the counting of the Homecoming Queen ballots and that he now has the ballots at his home, he would like to move that Central Board delegate him to destroy said ballots. Motion seconded by Bon; carried unanimously.

Browman returned to the question of which freshman will be able to vote in the coming election. The situation was referred to Planning Committee.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
