The University of Montana will celebrate diversity with events that are open to the public during "Day of Dialogue: Building Communities of Difference" on Thursday, Nov. 8.

The annual event offers free presentations, performances, workshops, exhibits and more.

Exhibits will be on display all day in the University Center.

Two speakers will be featured during this year's "Day of Dialogue" events.

At 1 p.m. in the University Center Theater, Denise Juneau will present "Diversity in Our

Kendall specializes in issues of diversity and social justice and has focused for more than 30 years on organizational change and communication. She is the author of "Understanding White Privilege: Creating Pathways to Authentic Relationships Across Race."

At 6 p.m. the Associated Students of UM will host a reception in the University Center Atrium. Refreshments will be provided.

The day concludes at 7 p.m. in the University Center Ballroom with a special performance by Step Afrika.
