GLOBAL TRADE PROGRAM OFFERED IN BUTTE NOV. 8-9

MISSOULA –

The third and closing segment of the Global Trade Certificate Program will take place Thursday and Friday, Nov. 8-9, at Montana Tech of The University of Montana in **Butte**.

“Putting it all Together: The Essential Tools for Successful Global Transactions” will be held from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Nov. 8 – with a reception in the evening – and from 9 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Nov. 9.

Topics covered will include multilateral financing, global communication and negotiations, patents, trademarks, intellectual properties, export financing tools, risk mitigation, closing deals, and more. The keynote speaker will be Larry Harrington, Mexico representative of the Inter-America Development Bank.

The three-part program is offered by the Governor’s Office of Economic Development, the Montana World Trade Center and the Small Business Administration. Those completing the program will be listed in a state directory of global trade professionals and are eligible for up to 40 hours of continuing education credits or nine hours of continuing legal education credits.

The first segment of the program kicked off in Bozeman in September, followed by part

two in Missoula in October. Organizers have received a lot of positive feedback, and they intend to repeat the program in spring or fall 2008.
