Homework: You must complete the assigned pages before coming to class each day. The homework for each day will be listed on the board under "TAREA". Homework will be assigned almost every day and is graded and collected only on the day it is due.

Please learn and review the meaning of the verbs until you know them and dream about them. Please study the conjugations.

Grammar: Spanish will be spoken during most of every class period. Grammar will be taught in Spanish, but may be taught in English when necessary. Focus on using Spanish in class. Please write down any questions you have in English during the Spanish speaking portion of class and ask these questions only after the grammar lesson, during the last five minutes of class or in my office. This is in order to encourage you to use Spanish as much as possible during most of the class. Try and write down an example of the Spanish structure you have a question about as an example to help clarify your question.

You will have no trouble comprehending the Spanish spoken in class, if you memorize the vocabulary lists in the text and the workbook, review past vocabulary, complete your written homework, complete all of the readings, complete all of the text and workbook pages on schedule and read the grammar explanations carefully. Extra readings will be available on Blackboard and ERES.

Schedule: This schedule may change.

We should complete one chapter in both texts about every two weeks. We will complete 6 chapters in both texts and the workbook this semester. A quiz will be given every week or every two weeks.

A comprehensive final may be given.

Various essays will be assigned.
