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Central Board Minutes
May 25, 1960

Absent: Brown, Stone, Lee

The meeting was called to order by President Paul Ulrich in the Silver Bow Room. The minutes were corrected as follows:

May 18--Under Vice President's report on Big Name Bands, spelling corrected to Schlesinger. Under Elections Committee, add: Whitelaw and Carlson, the Sophomore and Junior candidates receiving the most votes, will serve two year terms.

May 22, Under 1960-61 Budget : Bradley also suggested that Model United Nations Delegates give reports to the students upon their return and that if the fund for this purpose does not receive support from the University or the publicity, that the fund be cut from the budget.

Under Miscellaneous: agenda is spelled agenda.

ALL SCHOOL SHOW

Dave Browman reported that the All School Show "Oklahoma" made \$4,505. gross profit. He has paid \$2700 worth of bills and estimated the remainder of outstanding bills to make a total of \$3840. The show has made at least \$665 profit. Ulrich stated that Browman should be commended and complimented for managing the only all school show in history to make money. Browman then asked when Central Board would like to pay his salary of \$25.

PUBLIC RELATIONS

Jerry Agen reported on the progress on public relations during the past year. He said that Hometown News Committee under the direction of Gail Gunterman had sent out notices to hometown newspapers of the activities of students here at MSU. Also radio programs were taped and sent to Montana radio stations, using local students from that community as speakers.

Alumni Relations was under the chairmanship of David

Hunt until January, when he submitted his resignation and Carol Spaulding was appointed. Under her the committee accomplished many things, among them: a University section was added to the Alumni News; Alumni news was sent to the Kaimin; A "Silent Service" award has been set up and will be awarded annually, beginning next year, to an outstanding student who has received no recognition.

Agen also reported that Campus Visitations, under the direction of Stash Ashmore, had made plans during the year for a Booster Night in Butte which was cancelled at the last minute. Plans had also been made for various other groups to visit the

campus, but these too, had been cancelled. During spring quarter Ashmore resigned and Bill Lingard was appointed. The duties for this committee were not clearly defined. Traditions Board had started work on the Interscholastic Barbecue when Lingard was appointed. Each thought the other would handle the business. Agen said this committee has the greatest potential of all the subordinating committees under Public Relations but that it also needs the most work.

The Entire department has started many new programs this past year:

1. Christmas Program--representatives were sent to high schools in their hometown areas during Christmas vacation to talk to the senior class
2. A survey of high schools has been made comparing the type of MSU programs sent on tours. The results show that music programs are the most popular with high school students in the small and medium sized schools. Next ranking is the College and Career Days.
3. An attempt to get Boys State at Montana State University was made unsucessfully. Earlier attempts will be made for next year.
4. A brochure on campus life and student government will be sent to all high school students.
5. The committee has contacted the Greater University of Oregon to inquire about their program for public relations.
6. A movie project has been started with a permanent fund set up for this purpose. Agen predicts a movie of campus life in the very near future.
7. Radio programs for local radio stations have been set up.

Agen believes that the University has raised in the eyes of the public. Much of this has been accomplished through President Newburn with the help of renewed efforts on the part of the students. Agen also complimented the Kaimin for their efforts on the good will project.

Cogswell asked if Dr. ^{Jorgensen} ~~Jourgensen~~ was helping with the radio programs. Agen replied that most of the work was done in his department.

Carlson asked if the movie were still being worked on. Agen reported that Montegna has been appointed as director and he was planning on seeing the job through. Alumni have given the committee hope along money lines. Letters asking for such help were sent to all departments. The only department not yet heard from in the athletic department.

Ulvila asked about procedures for reestablishing College and Career Days. Agen said the new chairman should contact Miss Harriet Miller

VICE PRESIDENT

Datsopoulos presented a temporary list of committee chairmen and members. He stated that the deadline for committee applications would be extended until Wednesday, June 1, and that Student-Faculty Committee Applications are available at the Lodge desk,; the deadline for these applications is also Wednesday, June 1, at 4:00. Datsopoulos said that he would take applications to the living groups and pick them up again after deadline time. Ulrich asked for any interested Central Board members to meet June 1, at 4:00, to discuss the applicants.

JUDICIAL COUNCIL

Bob Connole reported that Judicial Council has met every Thursday night at 7:00 to review cases. Brad Dugdale is the new chairman for 1960-61. During the past year J Council has seen three chairmen: Jerry Metcalf, Helen Loy, and finally Connole. Since fall the council has reviewed 49 cases, with such examples as: beer in the dorm, minors drinking, disorderly conduct, "beverage" trouble at functions, football and basketball games. Many of the cases are handled by the dorms and AWS. Each case is interviewed separately with such punishments as probation with grades, hours and campuses, etc. If a student is placed on scholarship probation and does not make the required grade point average, he must have another hearing before the council and might have to apply for readmission through the Dean's Office. Other penalties are: removal of driving privileges, students in apartments being made to move into the dorms, removal of athletic scholarships. Judicial Council applications are available at the Lodge desk. The council needs 3 junior men, 3 junior women, 1 senior man, and a secretary. The applicants are to be interviewed by holdover members and six members of Central Board including the president, Monday, May 30 at 7:00 p.m.

Whitelaw asked about the expulsion. Connole answered that in some cases almost automatic expulsion takes place, but that there has been only one such case during the year and that he was a "five time loser". Only about 8 or 10 cases have been repeated and these were because of failure to meet grade requirements. Cogswell expressed his opinion that there seemed to be better behavior as a whole this year than last.

BY-LAW CHANGES

Colness moved the acceptance of the following change in Division II Article XI (Public Relations Committee)

Sec. 1 This committee shall consist of a general chairman and a student secretary appointed by Central Board, under which there shall be subordinate committees as follows:

A. Campus Visitation Committee shall consist of a chairman and student members appointed by Central Board, The Assistant to the President, Dean of the Music School, a Spur and a Bear Paw.

B. Hometown News Committee shall consist of a chairman and student members appointed by Central Board.

C. Radio and TV Committee shall consist of a chairman and student members appointed by Central Board.

D. Alumni Relations Committee shall consist of a chairman and student members appointed by Central Board.

E. Public Relations Travel Fund Committee shall consist of a chairman and student members appointed by Central Board.

Sec. 3 Duties. The general chairman shall direct and coordinate the activities of the various subordinate committees.

A. Campus Visitation Committee shall plan and direct programs for campus visitors.

B. Hometown news Committee shall submit stories to the MSU News Service concerning the activities of students, keeping a copy of each story and news item in its committee file.

C. Radio and TV Committee shall plan and supervise production of radio and TV programs distributed throughout the state in cooperation with the Radio-TV Department.

D. Alumni Relations Committee shall secure and keep working relationships with the Alumni Secretary, the officers of the Alumni Association and the local Alumni chapter to maintain communication between the students and alumni and to plan common projects.

E. Public Relations Travel Fund Committee shall administer the monies in the Public Relations Travel Fund. This committee shall work with the groups receiving money from this fund to insure as complete a coverage of the state as possible.

Seconded by Ulvila. Passed 13-0. Morris then moved the approval of the change in Division V, Art. II Sec. 3.

(added) There shall be a coordinator of the student membership of the above committees. This person shall report to Central Board the actions of the above committees and serve as a means of communication between these student-faculty committees and Central Board. ←

Seconded by Dodge. Ulrich explained that this creation of a coordinator of committees will improve correspondence between the faculty and the student groups. In the past the vice president has handled this, but it was too big of a job to do along with coordinating ASMSU committees. Motion was passed 13-0.

Johnson then moved the following changes in Division V, Art. III, Sec. 1, (3)

Change two to the

Division II, Art. 13, Sec. 3.

This committee, whose members shall be the student members of the student-faculty Public Exercises Committee, shall work with this committee to arrange for and contract such lecturers as shall be paid from ASMSU and University funds set aside for this purpose.

Seconded by Colness and passed 12-0 with Carlson abstaining.

COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS

A meeting was held Tuesday, May 24, with all interested applicants for chairman positions to review duties.

A meeting was also held Tuesday evening at 7:00 for Central Board members to go over the lists of applicants. Whitelaw moved the acceptance of the list of committee chairmen and members with the understanding that it is to be enlarged since application deadline has been extended. Chairmen will be able to remove any inactive members throughout the year. Applications for freshmen and students not now in attendance will be available fall quarter.

Dr. Newburn expressed his unwillingness to be placed in the position to have to choose two members from a brief list as has happened in years past. Dean Cogswell suggested to leave the choice entirely up to the president to do as he wishes., and that it is the responsibility of the President of ASMSU to talk to Newburn to settle the situation. Otherwise this might involve embarrassment on both sides. Central Board suggested the names of Stone in the professional school and Brown in the college of arts and sciences to be recommended to Dr. Newburn. Ulrich will arrange a meeting with the President to decide faculty advisers. As to the adviser from the administration Dean Cogswell will be recommended.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:15.
