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Central Board Minutes
October 14, 1959

The meeting was called to order in the Silver Bow Room by President Ed Risse. Voting Delegates were asked to sit in the front row so that they can be distinguished from non-voting delegates during discussion. The minutes were corrected as follows:

PROPOSED SIGN

Mr. Vanderboss of the Electrical Products Company presented a sketch of a neon display with billboard attached that would advertise M.S.U. This sign was suggested by the Athletic Department and will be placed at the junction of U.S. 10 and Madison Street. The cost will be approximately \$53,000. The electric bill for this sign will be approximately \$2.50 per month. It will be 22 feet in height. Mr. Vanderboss explained that he wasn't asking for a definite commitment but that he merely wanted approval or disapproval of the idea of this sign. McGlashan asked just who would pay for the sign. He replied that it had not yet been decided who would pay the expense. It was the opinion of Central Board that this sign is an excellent idea.

Risse replied that this late in the quarter, it was virtually impossible to waste any more time and that since Ashmore had been interested last spring and that he would be a good choice.

Adams moved that Agen be accepted for the position. Martin seconded and after a discussion of qualifications, the motion passed 8-1, Bradley opposing.

HOMECOMING COMMITTEE

Dougdale reported that plans were coming right along. Candidates have been chosen and teas and interviews were being held. The ~~six~~ finalists will be announced tomorrow. Plans for the Sos and noise parade are being made. Risse said that the Foresters have offered the debris from their Ball to help make the fire a big one.

TRADITIONS BOARD

Simon reported that a train to Bozeman is being set up. The special fare will be \$5.95 plus 60¢ tax as opposed to the regular fare of \$10.75 plus \$1.08 tax. The trip will take from 5 to 5½ hours. The schedule will be arranged later. 300 tickets (not including the band) will have to be sold in order to take the train. We will have until November 2nd to the the Railroad company know. Traditions Board would like to handle the concessions on the train to help defray expenses. Song sheets will be passed out at the games from now on so that students can learn the school songs. There seems to be some interest in Grizzly Growlers and if the freshmen show enough interest the group will be re-organized.

Venture, Editor, Dave Kubach; Business manager, Toni Richardson; Advisor, Mr. John Schwarz; Sponsors, Mr. Seymour Betsky, Mr. Jacob Vinocur. Meyers moved that these recommendations be accepted and Bradley seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

BUDGET & FINANCE

Hansen moved that Central Board allocate \$50.00 to be given in the form of a scholarship to the homecoming queen in the hope that the alums would match this figure. Meyers seconded and the motion passed unanimously. Meyers suggested that Central Board and the alums make this a permanent policy.

Hansen moved that any losses on the train trip to Bozeman for the Bobcat-Grizzly game be underwritten by Traditions Board and that Traditions Board be allowed to operate the concessions. He explained that the loss would not be more than \$200 because if the loss was larger, the train would be cancelled. Bradley seconded and the motion carried unanimously.


Next Hansen moved that \$200 to fulfill trou responsibilities of the Montana Masquers be granted from the special fund. It was passed 7-0 with 2 abstaining.

NEW BUSINESS

Risse said that the student body president from Bozeman had contacted him and suggested a meeting before the Bobcat-Grizzly Game. It was decided that Bozeman would come up here due to our heavy social schedule and would be entertained at a coffee hour after the game on Saturday, October 24th. Sankovich moved that we furnish lodging for them on Saturday night. Meyers seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
