Central Board Minutes
October 23, 1959

ABSENT

Martin

The meeting was called to order by President Ed Risse.

The minutes were corrected as follows:

October 21, 1959 minutes :

Mr. Stone moved that a quorum of five be appointed to act for Central Board at the MSU-MSC meeting. The motion passed 10-0.

October 24, 1959 minutes:

In resolution # 2 the wording was changed to read as follows: The president of the host school will meet (not both school will meet).

Risse extended a formal welcome to the new Freshman delegates Morris, Romstad, and Pemberton.

Mr. Brown congratulated Central Board on their fine job of making the meeting between the student governments of MSU-MSC a very aimiable one.

Risse extended thanks to the Foresters for piling the trees from the ball at the field house for the homecoming bonfire. The foresters piled the trees on their own and Central Board extends its appreciation.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Portland State College sent us some information on their Winter Carnival which will be held February 27 & 28, 1960 at the Timber Line Lodge on Mount Hood. Anyone who is interested in going, contact Risse.

Also, The University of Idaho extended an invitation to their Borah Conference which is held annually in honor of a past Senator of the State of Idaho. It will be held some time during winter quarter. Anyone interested in going, contact Risse.

The following committe has been appointed with authority to represent ASMSU with the University Administration and others concerning management and reincorporation of the Student Store, until such time as the store is reincorporated. The committee consists of Store Board plus two as follows:

BUDGET & FINANCE

Hansen moved that \$6.14 be taken from the General Fund for expenses during the Freshman primary and general elections. Meyer seconded and the motion passed 15-0.

The Music Department has requested a total of \$1,500 for traveling expenses this year. Hansen emphasized the public relations job that all of the music organizations do throughout the state. Hansen moved that this be allowed, Lee seconded and the motion passed 15-0.

In view of a December 16, 1958 motion, Hansen announced that \$1965.25 was being transferred from Store Board funds to the Athletic Department.

VICE-PRESIDENT

Adams reported that the Homecoming election results would be counted by freshman and they would be rotated so that no one would know the results until the queen was crowned. He also suggested that Dr. Brown, as faculty advisor, and Brad Dugdale, as chairman of the homecoming committee, also be present when the final tally is counted and know the results of the election.

ASMSU has acquired a mimeograph machine for \$200 plus trade-in. Student Union will pay \$150 if the machine can be kept in Mr. Martell's office. It will be available to any authorized University organization, but ASMSU will be using it 90% of the time. Bradley suggested that since ASMSU will be using it most of the time, why not buy it ourselves. Harris said that perhaps AWS would be able to pay some of the price but she would have to check for sure. Bradley moved that ASMSU buy the mimeograph machine setting up a policy whereby students with a pre-typed stencil and their own paper may use the machine and it would be kept in the ASMSU office. Tate seconded and the motion carried 15-0.

Adams said that the minutes from committee meetings have not been coming in. They should be in within a week after the meeting. He said if this negligence continues, he felt that removal of office for the chairmen might be necessary.

ELECTIONS

Joseph said that voting booths for the homecoming queen election would be set up in the Bus. Ad., Forestry, and Lodge buildings. The hours for voting will be from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The counting will begin promptly at 5:00 p.m. and they should be through by 7:00 p.m., probably sooner. Dr. Brown, Kathy Joseph, and Brad Dugdale will be the only ones who know the results of the election.

Joseph suggested that the candidates not be told who won until it is announced to the public at the S.O.S. The policy in the past has been to tell the girls just before the S.O.S. starts. Adams moved that the candidates not be told. Sankovich seconded the motion. It passed 9-2 opposed (Tate and Lee - 3 abstaining (Ulrich, Nichols, and Romstad.

TRADITIONS BOARD

Simon reported that the tickets for the Bebat-Grizzly game are printed and on sale now. T-Board has decided that it would be better to lease the refreshment stands on the train.

Morris was asked to arrange to have the victory bell out in the Homecoming Parade.

ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE

The Homecoming Dance will be Saturday night with the Blue Hawks playing. There will be no publicity except a paid add in the Kaimin and a large banner in the Grill of the Lodge.

A "Friday, the 13th Stomp" was suggested as a possibility for a dance on Friday, November 13th.

NEW BUSINESS

Committee chairmen were asked to submit a list of all their active members so that pictures for the 1960 Sentinel could be taken. This will carry out the dropping old wood on committees program.

Risse said that a report of things ASMSU has accomplished this year was being submitted to the Kaimin for the homecoming edition.

Cogswell expressed his appreciation to the Independents for the fence around the oval.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
