FLORENCE STUDENTS RECEIVE UM SCHOLARSHIPS

MISSOULA—

Six students from **Florence** have been awarded scholarships from The University of Montana.

- Angela Andrews-Seegraber, a 2009 graduate of Big Sky High School, received a \$1,500 Donald W. Gute Memorial Scholarship. She will major in pre-law and political science at UM. Her parents are Frank Seegraber and Diana Andrews of Florence. The scholarship was established in 1966 by Mr. and Mrs. J. Russell Gute in memory of their son.
- Rae Baerlocher, a UM freshman in education, received a \$1,500 Bonhomme Scholarship. She is a 2008 graduate of Florence Carlton High School and the daughter of Sam and Julie Baerlocher of Florence. The Bonhomme Scholarship Fund was established in 2001 by the estate of Peter and Elvi Bonhomme of Big Timber.
- Virginia Blackwell, a 2009 graduate of Florence Carlton High School, received an \$8,000 Fox Foundation Scholarship. She will major in pre-nursing at UM. Her parents are David and Beth Blackwell of Florence. The Fox Foundation Scholarship was established in 1960 by the estate of Sadie Fox, who moved to Montana with her family in 1887, first to Helena and then to a ranch near Stark. She married George Fox in 1905 and moved to Missoula in 1906.
- Bess Brownlee, a UM junior in photojournalism and media arts, received a \$1,500 Bonhomme Scholarship and a \$1,000 Don Anderson Scholarship. She is a 2006 graduate of Florence Carlton High School and the daughter of Gary and Peg Brownlee of Florence. The Don Anderson Scholarship was established in 1978 by Lee Enterprises in memory of Anderson, a native Montanan with a 45-year career in newspaper journalism.

- Alexa Cramer, a 2009 graduate of Florence Carlton High School, received an \$8,000 Haynes Foundation Scholarship. She is the daughter of Karla Cramer of Florence. Jack and Isabel Haynes, who owned and managed several Yellowstone Park photo shops, established the scholarship fund in 1960.
- Whitney Mann, a 2009 graduate of Florence Carlton High School, received a \$1,000 William Enderlein Scholarship. She will major in accounting at UM. Her parents are Chris and Twila Mann of Florence. The scholarship was established in 1997 through the estates of Philip and Esther Enderlein in memory of their son. Esther received a home economics degree at UM in 1931. Philip was a longtime Montana Power Co. employee.
- Rachel Warr, a UM freshman in art education, received a \$2,000 University Honors Scholarship. She is a 2008 graduate of Florence Carlton High School. Her parents are Howard and Linda Warr of Florence.
