Central Board Minutes
May 3, 1956

The meeting was called to order by President Gary Jystad. The minutes were read and approved.

BUDGET AND FINANCE:

Crippen read the prepared budget for ASMSU for 1956-57 as follows:

Gary Jystad then presented the gavel to John Fowler.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

Central Board Minutes
May 16, 1956

The meeting was called to order by President Fowler. The minutes were read and approved.

BUDGET AND FINANCE:

Cook reported that budget and finance had approved the extending of complementary tickets for "Carousel" to the ASMSU officers.

GENERAL ELECTIONS:

Riddle announced that an official report of the election results would be submitted to Central Board at the next meeting.

PUBLICITY-TRAVEL:

Lambros invited Central Board and the members of ASMSU committees to the picnic Sunday which is being sponsored jointly by publicity-travel and traditions board. Everyone is to meet in front of the Lodge Sunday at 1:00 and those who can do so are requested to bring cars.

He also reminded Central Board members to attend the events scheduled for the interscholastic meet including the SOS Thursday evening and the picnic and Newman Club song fest Friday evening. Friday and Saturday nights there will be dances in the Cascade Room from 9:00-12:00. Fowler urged that everyone attend in order to promote relations between the high schools and Montana State University.

CONVOCATION:

Pat Fox said that a convocation will be sponsored next Wednesday by the publicity-travel committee. It will be given by the school of music and will feature excerpts from "Carousel".

JUDICIAL COUNCIL:

Dave Burton, chairman of judicial council, requested that Central Board approve the recent action of judicial council concerning the Blackfoot Tavern. He emphasized that judicial council was representing the school. Riddle felt it was the duty of Central Board to back judicial council in this action. Burton explained that a complaint had been filed against the bartender for serving minors. If the bartender is found guilty the state liquor board will revoke the license of that tavern. Burton said that President McFarland had written letters to the three witnesses involved commending them for their action and promising them full support. Scriven asked why action was being taken only against the Blackfoot Tavern when other instances of selling liquor to minors have occurred at a number of other bars. Burton said that the closing of one will set an example for the others; this establishment had also been known to be serving minors for some time previous to the fatal accident and its out-of-town location increased the possibility of an accident. Wacker moved that Central Board whole-heartedly support judicial council in the action taken against the Blackfoot Tavern. Fox seconded. Passed 10-1 (Scriven against).

COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS:

President Fowler said that the old officers Gary Jysted, Mary Ellen Erickson, Ann Crocker and Bruce Crippen had been appointed to a special temporary committee to investigate the possibilities of joining N.S.A and of hiring a secretary for ASMSU. Fox suggested that another member of Central

Board be appointed to this committee also. Fowler said he felt that the old officers were best qualified to study the situation since they have had the experience of holding ASMSU offices. He said they would submit a written report in the form of a recommendation to Central Board later this year which would be voted upon. Riddle moved that Central Board accept the proposal permitting the old ASMSU officers to investigate the possibilities of N.S.A. and the hiring of an ASMSU secretary. Wacker seconded. Passed 11-0.

ASMSU COMMITTEE APPLICATIONS:

Fowler announced that application blanks for ASMSU committees will be available May 19th at the main desk in the Lodge and will be distributed to the living groups at that time. This year they will include a brief statement concerning the duties of each committee. The deadline for returning them is 5:00 P.M. Friday, May 25th. They are to be taken to the main desk at the Lodge.

SIBLEY AWARD:

Fowler said that the Sibley Award is to be presented to the person who has contributed the most to MSU traditions. The presentation will be made at the SOS on Thursday evening at 7:30.

OFFICE HOURS:

Temporary office hours have been set up for the remainder of this quarter. There will be an officer in the ASMSU office every noon from 12:00-1:00.

MEETING:

Fowler said that regular Central Board meetings will be held each Wednesday at 4:00. There will be a special Central Board meeting at 4:00 on Saturday, May 26, in order to approve the ASMSU committee appointments.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

DETAILS CONCERNING THE PROPOSED GOLF COURSE

One of the needs of an expanding university such as ours is the provision of adequate recreational facilities for the students. In recognition of this the administration and the student government have both been working toward the procurement of bowling alleys, skating rink, tennis courts, golf course and swimming pool. Unfortunately, we are not able to secure all of these things at once but must move forward when the funds are available and the opportunity presents itself. Thus far we have secured six bowling alleys, six tennis courts, and a skating rink. The athletic department is already equipped with a swimming pool.

Admittedly, these facilities are not adequate for a university of our size, but they are a start and investigations considering increasing and expanding all of them are now underway.

The need for a golf course definitely exists for a fairly large proportion of our campus population.

1. Many students enjoy golf but in order to play must either drive 70 miles to Polson or play twice a year for a fee at the Missoula Country Club.
2. Participation in the golf classes of the Physical Education Department is increasing every year, but after completion of the class most students have no place to play.
3. The University golf team, which has one of the best overall records of any team we have entered in the Skyline Conference, is a team without a course of their own on which to play.

The student government currently has \$43,000 in its reserve fund. The cost of the proposed course would be between \$45,000 and \$50,000. Like the money invested in buildings and other campus improvements these funds are separate from and not available for those used for teacher's salaries. This money could be loaned to the University which would invest it in a golf course. Under this method of financing, the cost of play would be kept nominal for students. The course could be available for play by townspeople for a fee during the summer and revenue for maintenance and repayment of any financial obligations could be received in this way.

We have the land. A student-faculty committee has investigated the matter extensively and complete plans for the construction of an attractive, all grass, nine hole course, which could be expanded to eighteen holes, have been drawn up. If we proceed now, the work can be done this summer and the course can be available for student use next spring.

Note: Central Board is planning to take action on this matter at its final meeting, May 31. Any interested group is invited to call the ASMSU office between 12:00 and 1:00 P.M. any day to make an appointment for a Central Board member or an officer to come and discuss the problem with them. In addition, all interested students are invited to attend this meeting to discuss the proposal.

Officers, ASMSU
