Central Board Minutes
October 7, 1955

The meeting was called to order by President Jystad. The minutes were read and approved.

PUBLICATIONS BOARD

Rick Lee, chairman of the committee reported the resignations of Norma Beaty and Coleman who have been associate editors on the Kaimin. Lee also reported that the committee is to select one other member as associate editor of the Kaimin. The committee presented the following names for approval as associate editors: Judy Weaver and Bill Larkum. Fowler moved to accept the committee's recommendation. Crippen seconded. Passed 7-0. The third editor will be chosen later.

ACTIVITIES BOARD

Erickson reported that her committees are attempting to schedule an activity for the lodge every week-end. Jystad reported on the Phi Kappa Phi suggestion for a lecture series which that organization might sponsor. Erickson reported that this series would not interfere with the plans of the lecture committee of Activities Board.

FRESHMAN ELECTIONS

Riddle reported that the primary election for the officers of the Freshman class is postponed until October 20. The final election is to be October 27. He further announced that all petitions for candidacy are to be submitted to the office by Saturday, October 15.

KAIMIN

Jystad told the board that there is possibility of a weekly column in the Kaimin dealing with Central Board, and probably written by the members of Central Board.

ACTIVITY CARDS

Jystad reported that it has been discovered that several students have misrepresented their age on the picture-activity-cards. In the discussion which followed, it was decided that the students perhaps did not realize the full significance of the card or the seriousness of the deed. Considering this, it was decided that the penalty of expulsion was too severe. Crippen moved that the students be notified that those who have falsified their correct ages on the cards report themselves to the ASMSU office, and their cards will be re-made with the correct data appearing on the card, at the cost of one dollar to the student. Other students, whose cards are incorrect are to also have their cards remade at no cost to the student. Lambros seconded. Passed 8-0.

MONTANA PENNANT

Jystad suggested that Budget and Finance allot money for the purchase of a Montana pennant for the ASMSU office. Lambros moved this be done. Leuthold seconded. Passed 7-0.

LETTER TO TEAM

Jystad suggested that a letter expressing faith in and appreciation of our football team be sent to them from the student body. Leuthold suggested that we also send the team telegrams when they are playing out of town.

APPRECIATION

Jystad suggested that Central Board express its appreciation to the switch board operators for their fine service. Riddle moved this be done. Lambros seconded. Passed 7-0.

DRINKING COMMITTEE

It was announced that the Committee on the Drinking Problem be notified of the meeting of the group on Wednesday, October 12, at three o'clock. Jystad appointed Leuthold chairman of the committee. Jystad will act as ex-officio chairman.

CITIZENS COMMITTEE ON ALCOHOLISM

Jystad read a letter from the Missoula Citizen's Committee on Alcoholism, in which that group offered a series of programs to the student body. It was decided that this was not the type of information which is pertinent to the problem on campus - which is that of regulation and not treatment of the alcoholic or addicted.

CHAPARONES

It was suggested that a letter from Central Board be sent to the Faculty explaining to them that the students are willing to enforce the drinking rules, and encourageing them to accept invitations to chaparone functions.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
