### STATEMENT OF SENATOR MIKE MANSFIELD (D. MONTANA)

## Aid to Federally Affected Area - Montana

Mr. President, for some years now the Federal Government has been making a responsible contribution to the education of our young people in areas where there is a noticeable impact by the Federal Government in one form or another. The two programs through which this aid is administered are Public Laws 815 and 874. These Federal grant-in-aid programs have been of considerable importance in my State of Montana because of the large amount of Federal lands, a large influx of Federal personnel in conjunction with air bases and missile installations, and seven Indian Reservations.

The Office of Education has provided me with tabulations which illustrate the importance of these aid programs to the State's school system in financial terms. These tabulations give a breakdown for those years since the inception of the program in 1951.

Table I shows by fiscal years the number of eligible applicants and the amounts paid to school districts under P. L. 874, which authorizes assistance for current operating expenses. Table II lists the 86 school districts in Montana which were eligible for assistance under Public Law 874 in fiscal year 1962 and the amount to which each school district was entitled under the provisions of the Act. Table III lists the Montana school districts which qualified for assistance for school construction during the twelve year period 1951 to 1962 under the terms of Public Law 815, together with the cumulative amounts for which each district qualified during that period. In this last category over \$11,000,000 has been allocated to Montana since 1951.

Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to have these tables printed in the Congressional Record at the conclusion of my remarks.
