EEOC CHAIRMAN TO KEYNOTE  
EQUAL EMPLOYMENT SEMINAR

MISSOULA--

William H. Brown, III, chairman of the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) in Washington, D.C., will be afternoon guest panelist and the keynote speaker at a luncheon Friday (March 10) during the seminar on equal employment problems at the University of Montana.

Friday's program is cosponsored by the University of Montana School of Law and the Western Montana Bar Association under the CLEM (Continuing Legal Education--Montana) program. Registration will be from 11:30 a.m.-12:15 p.m. Friday in the University Center Montana Rooms. The luncheon is set for 12:15 p.m. in the UC Montana Rooms. Reservation deadline at the UM School of Law is Wednesday (March 8).

All persons interested in equal employment are invited to attend Friday's program. For further information contact the UM law school.

During the luncheon address, Brown will explain the organization, functions and objectives of the EEOC. The address will serve as a background for a more detailed description of equal employment problems in a discussion during the afternoon.

An attorney with several law firms in Philadelphia, Pa., from 1956-68, Brown served as chief of frauds from April to September 1968 in the Philadelphia District Attorney's Office and he was deputy district attorney with that office from September to November 1968.

He was appointed EEOC commissioner in November 1968, a position he held until May 1969, when he was named EEOC chairman.
