Dr. William G. Stoner, a native Montanan and an alumnus of Montana State University, has been appointed an associate professor to head the school counselor training program in the MSU School of Education, Dean Linus J. Carleton announced.

Dean Carleton explained that Dr. Stoner will be responsible for the professional training of guidance counselors, a School-of-Education function distinct from the services provided students by the MSU Counseling and Guidance Center.

Dr. Stoner comes to MSU winter quarter after two years as director of guidance services for the Fontana, Calif., Unified School District. He directed guidance services for the San Juan, Calif., Unified School District for more than five years. He has also been a county guidance director in Idaho, a consultant in guidance to California schools and a part-time supervisor of counselor training at Sacramento State College in California.

Dr. Stoner was born in Manhattan in 1920. After receiving a B. A. from MSU in 1948, he earned an M. A. from the University of Minnesota in 1949 and a doctor of education degree from Stanford University in 1956. His wife, the former Dorothy Kimball of Savage, also holds a bachelor's degree from MSU and a master's degree from the University of Minnesota. Their two sons attend the Paxson School.
