DR. MECH TO GIVE LECTURE-SLIDE
SHOW ON WOLVES AT UNIVERSITY

MISSOULA--

Dr. David L. Mech of the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, will present a lecture-slide show on his work with wolves in northern Minnesota and on Isle Royale at the University of Montana Wednesday (April 19).

The presentation, which is sponsored by the Program Council of the Associated Students of UM and the UM School of Forestry, will begin at 8 p.m. in the UM Science Complex, room 131. The public is invited to attend free of charge. Lecture title is "The Wolf: Ecology of an Endangered Species."

Dr. Mech has been studying wolves, particularly in the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Minnesota in northern / for the last four years. His work contributed to the formulation of a management plan drawn up by the Superior National Forest, prohibiting the taking of wolves on federal lands.

Dr. Mech has also traveled to Africa to assist biologists initiating a study of cheetahs and to the Arctic to study and photograph wolves.
