ENGLISH PROFESSOR TO PRESENT  
LECTURE AT UM APRIL 26

MISSOULA--

James N. Britton, Goldsmiths' professor of education at the University of London, will present a free public lecture entitled "Writing to Learn and Learning to Write" at 8 p.m. Wednesday (April 26) at the University of Montana.

The lecture, co-sponsored by the UM English department and the National Council of Teachers of English, will be in room 11 of the Liberal Arts Building.

Dr. Britton's lecture will explore the values of writing for self-development and the factors involved in learning to write effectively. As the chairman of the National Association for the Teaching of English in the United Kingdom, Dr. Britton has been engaged in research on the development of writing ability of children. The emphasis of this study is on the processes involved in learning to write within the logic of students.

Dr. Britton will explain the range of functions for which writing is typically used and the varieties of audience to which the work is addressed.

Teachers, students and the general public are invited to attend.
