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Central Board Minutes
Oct. 21, 1954

The meeting was called to order in the Eloise Knowles room. Minutes were read and discussed and corrected as follows:

The spelling of Dr. Hertler's name was corrected to read Dr. Hertler on the ice rink committee.

Bachman explained that the allocations of the general fund, approved at the last meeting, were the usual ones, done every year.

Wunderlich questioned the title of "Director of Student Affairs," as listed in the Oct. 14 minutes. He suggested the subject come up for discussion at a later date.

TRADITIONS BOARD

Johan Miller stated that the Grizzly Growlers need \$63 to buy 180 small cowbells, which they plan to sell as a money-making project. The profits would be used to pay for renovation of the card section. Since the money was asked for just as a loan, he was advised that he could take care of it through Traditions Board without Central Board approval. DeForth moved that Grizzly Growlers be allowed to sell the cowbells, seconded by Lambros, passed unanimously.

Miller said a meeting to plan Dad's Day, Nov. 13, would be held tomorrow, and that one of the plans was to invite the Dad's of MSC students.

He said the money collected during the proclaimed Olympic Day had been turned over to Paul Chumrau, and that it was probably less than \$75, although he had not counted it.

It was asked if the bell ringing might not bother the players at the games, since they appeared to object to the foot stamping in the stands. Leuthold said that it might be hard to hear in a huddle, but that it wouldn't bother the team on the whole.

Judy Adams has resigned from Traditions Board, and Miller suggested Patsy Anderson. Abbott moved that she be approved, Leuthold seconded it, and it was passed unanimously.

FROSH ELECTIONS

Lambros reported that petitions for the freshman candidates will be validated by Central Board the Monday of the week of elections. Chaney arranged to call a special meeting of Central Board Monday at 4 p.m. to take care of the petitions. Lambros reported that he has really had good cooperation in getting the elections set up.

Both activity cards and signatures will be required for voting, he emphasized.

PUBLICATIONS BOARD

The recommended appointment of Barbara Mellott as associate editor for the Kaimin was approved unanimously.

BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE

Bachman reported that the committee had been working on the proposed faculty activity cards. A questionnaire has been sent out to 14 western schools to find out what they do, and there has been an informal questioning of the faculty.

SOCIAL COMMITTEE

O'Hare reported that there will be an ASMSU-AWS mixer Nov. 13 after the Bob-cat Grizzly game.

O'Hare emphasized strongly that fraternities and sororities and other living groups cannot change their social dates without contacting the social committee. She said that some had been changed through the dean of students' office, and that consequently there would have been four major fraternity parties the night of Nov. 20.

HONOR SYSTEM

O'Hare recommended a tentative honor system committee, composed of Russ Pfohl, Georgiana Coppedge, John Earll, and two faculty members. She said the committee was not complete because the faculty members had not been definitely designated and the Independents had not submitted a nomination.

LEADERSHIP CAMP

Lambros, Bruce Crippen, and Betty Elmore were recommended as the three chairmen of leadership camp this year. Bachman moved they be accepted, O'Hare seconded, and it was passed unanimously.

ICE RINK COMMITTEE

Gaughan, in answer to a question about the high school representation on the ice rink committee, said that an entire committee had been appointed at the high school to make recommendations to the University rink committee.

ACTIVITY INTEREST CARDS

Lambros is chairman of a group which will go around to the living groups, discuss campus activities and the purpose of the activity cards, and have them filled out. It was suggested that the cards be given to the class officers to handle.

M BOOK COMMITTEE

Chaney pointed out that in past years, this job has always fallen to Missoula students during the summer. Bachman thought it would be an excellent idea to appoint a committee this fall which could work on the book during the year, as Chaney suggested. Fowler suggested having one Missoula person on the committee to take care of problems that might arise at the print shop during the summer. It was suggested that we call for all who might be interested in working on the book in the Kaimin.

LETTER TO BREEN

Eyer suggested that the secretary write a letter to Bob Breen, requesting a statement of Field House finances. He says he's heard rumors that the Field House is losing money. Several persons pointed out that Central Board has a direct responsibility to the students as far as the Field House goes. Wunderlich said we need more student participation.

Chaney said that he, Russ Pfohl, and Outside Entertainment committee were going to work more closely with Breen in planning Field House events.

A question was also raised about the work of the coordinating committee set up by last year's group, which was to coordinate particularly activities in the MSU auditoria, among other things?

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
