FORMER KAIMIN EDITOR
TO SPEAK MAY 2 AT UM

MISSOULA--

Wilbur Wood, a former reporter for the San Francisco Bay Guardian and editor of the Montana Kaimin in 1963-64, will present a public reading of his poetry and journalistic writings at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday (May 2) in the Journalism Library.

Wood is meeting with journalism and English classes through May 2. He was graduated from UM in 1964 with majors in journalism and English and subsequently studied with various poets at San Francisco State College, which awarded him a master's degree in 1967.

He began writing for the independent muckraking newspaper the Bay Guardian in 1967, covering events such as the first Huey Newton trial, the student revolutionary movement in Mexico City, the San Francisco State College student strike, the People's Park controversy and the San Francisco Bay oil spill.

His articles and poems have appeared in the Bay Guardian, the Nation, Kayak and Clear Creek. A forthcoming article, "Report from Little Babylon," will appear in the 1972 Montana Journalism Review.

Wood's lectures and public reading are co-sponsored by the UM College of Arts and Sciences and the School of Journalism.
