1972 UM PHARMACY GRADUATE  
MAKES INITIAL DONATION  
TO DEVELOPMENT FUND

MISSOULA--

Barbara Ostby Danielson, a pharmacist in Medicine Lake, who is a June '72 graduate of the University of Montana, has given the initial contribution of \$309 to the UM School of Pharmacy Development Fund.

Mrs. Danielson is daughter of Emery J. Ostby of Froid.

Dr. Robert L. Van Horne, dean of the UM School of Pharmacy, said the fund was established a year ago when it was suggested that the school could obtain contributions for new buildings and remodeling from pharmacy school alumni.

The idea for establishing the development fund was introduced to University alumni at the Montana State Pharmaceutical Association Convention in Butte last spring by Dr. Raymond J. Bennett, professor of pharmacy administration at UM, who is MSPA president.

Van Horne said he is "very pleased though somewhat surprised that the initial contribution to the fund was made by such a recent graduate of the school."
