KOEPPEN TO SERVE  
AS 1973 NATEBOE PRESIDENT

MISSOULA--

Dr. Donald B. Koeppen, chairman of the University of Montana Department of Business Education and Office Administration, has been elected president of the National Association of Teacher Educators of Business and Office Education (N.A.T.E.B.O.E.).

Koeppen, who joined the UM faculty in September 1967, was elected to the post at the American Vocational Association Convention in Portland, Ore., one year ago.

N.A.T.E.B.O.E. is one of four national associations under the business and office education section of the AVA.

Koeppen's main duties will be to organize and coordinate activities for the 1973 convention, scheduled to be held in Atlanta, Ga. The general theme of the next convention will involve career education and research, Koeppen said.

A native of Walworth, Wis., Koeppen received his Bachelor of Education degree at Wisconsin State University, Whitewater, in 1950. The University of Wisconsin, Madison, awarded him his master's degree in 1954 and doctoral degree in 1966.
