JEAN WARREN TO DISCUSS
ENVIRONMENTAL MOVEMENT,
ENERGY CRISIS FRIDAY AT UM

MISSOULA--

"The Environmental Movement -- Strengthened or Destroyed by the Energy 'Crisis'?" will be the topic of a speech by Jean Warren, Missoula, during a public seminar Friday (Jan. 11) at the University of Montana. The program will begin at noon in room 307 of the UM Natural Science Building.

Warren, who is chairman of the Bitterroot-Mission Group of the Sierra Club, will evaluate the present energy situation in terms of supply and mismanagement, and she will provide evidence that blame for the energy crisis should not be placed on the environmental movement.

Besides being coordinator of the Solid Waste Management Workshops of the Western Montana Scientists' Committee for Public Information, Warren also is a member of the Missoula Area Chamber of Commerce's Natural Resources Council and the U.S. Forest Service Rock Creek Advisory Committee.

Friday's program is one in a series of weekly environmental seminars sponsored by the UM botany department. Dr. Meyer Chessin, botany professor, is coordinator of the series.
