Central Board Minutes
October 21, 1953

The meeting was called to order by Norm Anderson. The minutes were read. Briggs corrected the statement that the campaigning in the trees was illegal. He said that previously hanging signs from the trees was allowed.

Abel said the Music School Foundation will bring six concerts here. They will be played in the Music School auditorium. The series will cost 5.00 to townspeople. He said they'll save 50 tickets for one week for students. He suggested that we underwrite them for \$125.00 making the price \$2.50 for students. However, he said he thought they would hold 50 tickets without our underwriting them. The Music School Foundation is underwriting 100 tickets for music students.

Eyer said he didn't think the series would benefit enough students to merit underwriting the tickets. However, he moved that we reserve 50 for a week without underwriting them. It was seconded and passed.

Ryan said that in general Homecoming went well but that there were too many things going on at the same time as the bon fire.

Ryan said that Traditions Board is making six "Beat the Lobos" posters to put in the campus buildings. He said there will be a white shirt and tin can section at the New Mexico game.

Wunderlich suggested cleaning up the Variety Show. Anderson said that it was censored by members of the faculty at dress rehearsal.

Wunderlich suggested that we try to get a student on the Alumni Homecoming Committee so we could have ^{better} coordination of activities. Anderson said he'd try to get a student member of that committee.

Under Outside Entertainment Eyer reported that the Virginia City players will be here October 24 and 25. He said that ticket sales are going slow.

Hoiness reported that he'd the financial report of September 30 and that all the organizations were in good condition.

Anderson reported that Jim Gidley, Student Association President at MSC, wrote that their governing body said no to the proposed game between the Intramural Champs of the two schools.

Anderson said that the NP will not put any extra cars on a train to Bozeman. However, they will sell us 40 round trip tickets for \$6.50 each. The Highway Patrol said we couldn't have an organized caravan of cars.

Wunderlich reported that the Student Union Executive Board will handle the Student Placement Bureau from 1:30 to 5:00 in the afternoon. They recommended that the University and Central Board take it over from 9:00 to 12:00 in the morning. It will cost \$50.00 to \$75.00 a month and will amount to approximately \$700.00 for the rest of this year. The matter was turned over to Budget and Finance Committee.

Wunderlich suggested that we ask the foreign students to a Central Board meeting. He said we can invite them through Prof. Line. It was turned over to the Social Committee.

Ryan said he thought we should get a traveling trophy for the Homecoming Queen, in order to honor her all year. Hoiness said that there's an overemphasis

on trophies, that a living group shouldn't get credit for a queen, and that we have no place to display the trophy.

DeForth suggested that we give her a special seat at the games all year to honor her. Travis suggested that the old queen reign over Homecoming until a new one is crowned. Ryan moved that Central Board buy a traveling trophy. The motion was not seconded.

Travis reported that Publications Board recommended Georgia George as Sentinel Associate Editor. Hudson so moved, it was seconded and passed.

Doug Anderson said he didn't know when Sentinels would get here. However, they won't until November. He said positive steps are being taken so it won't happen again.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
