AFROTC CADET FROM UM
TO DISCUSS SCHOLARSHIPS
WITH FVCC STUDENTS FEB. 13

MISSOULA--

Jeffrey G. Butcher, Billings, an Air Force ROTC cadet at the University of Montana in Missoula, will discuss the scholarships available under the two-year AFROTC program at UM with students at Flathead Valley Community College, Kalispell, on Feb. 13.

Capt. David C. Hilger, information officer and aerospace studies instructor at UM, said the two-year program is designed for college transfer students from communities such as Kalispell. Students at FVCC who will have two or more years of college remaining this fall are eligible to apply.

"Each student enrolled in the AFROTC program at the University receives approximately \$2,000 tax free during his last two years of college," Hilger said. "Besides the \$2,000, scholarships also are available to the AFROTC cadets."
