IN FINAL PHASE OF KELLOGG PROGRAM

MISSOULA--

Mrs. Joyce D. Zacek (pronounced Zaacheck), a Hardin native, who is editor of the "Montana Business Quarterly," the regional economic and business magazine published by the University of Montana Bureau of Business and Economic Research, left Missoula Friday for a two-week overseas tour sponsored by the Kellogg Foundation.

The visit by Zacek to Italy, Ethiopia and Yugoslavia is the final phase of a two-year program of study and travel dealing with community leadership. A total of 25 program participants are making the trip, each under a \$3,000 fellowship awarded by the Kellogg Foundation in January 1972. The program began at Montana State University, Bozeman.

The overseas trip will include a motor coach ride across Yugoslavia, visits to corporate farms and tours of resorts along the Adriatic Coast. The group will camp near the Awash River in Ethiopia one night and also visit a sugar plantation there.

Commenting on the purposes of the overseas trip, Zacek said, "We are going to broaden our perspectives and to gain an understanding of other cultures. We want to arrange people-to-people contacts in Ethiopia and hope to do the same in Yugoslavia, with the idea that we can learn more about cultures from the people rather than from the respective governments."

The object of the two-year program is to improve the quality of life in Montana communities, she said.

The overseas tour is the third phase of the Kellogg program, which also has included state and national tours. The state portion included visits to MSU and to the Anaconda Co. operations in Butte, and the second phase was a national tour which included visits to Washington, D.C.; the Tennessee Valley Authority headquarters in Knoxville, Tenn., and to Mason City, Iowa, where the Kellogg program participants toured small industries.

Zacek is scheduled to return to Missoula Feb. 24. A debriefing involving the tourists will take place at MSU March 29-30.

Zacek, who formerly was administrative assistant in the UM Graduate School, received her bachelor's degree in history at UM in 1969.
