WIN IN NATS COLLEGE DIVISION

MISSOULA--

Julie Ellen Stewart, Missoula, and Robert J. Nix, Wibaux, music students at the University of Montana in Missoula, each won a \$100 award for placing first in the college division of the annual voice auditions sponsored by the Big Sky Chapter of the National Association of Teachers of Singing (NATS) during the weekend in Great Falls.

Both are students of George Lewis, a UM music professor. The awards will be used by Stewart and Nix for participation in a week's voice workshop this summer in the NATS northwest region. Stewart is daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert L. Stewart, Missoula, and Nix is son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph A. Nix, Wibaux.

Three other UM students placed high in the NATS competition. Jacqueline Kay Putnam, Billings, placed third in the women's competition, and Terry N. Larsen, Fort Benton, and Duane R. Conitz, Pendleton, Ore., formerly of Havre, placed second and third respectively, in the men's competition.

Ellen H. Magnuson, Helena, a student at Montana State University, Bozeman, placed second in the women's competition.
