#### GERCKEN TO DISCUSS BOOKS AT TEA GROUP MEETING WEDNESDAY

Richard Gercken, an associate professor and humanities librarian at the University of Montana, will present a book discussion entitled "Fiction Past and Present" during a meeting of the UM Women's Club Afternoon Tea Group on Wednesday (March 13).

The meeting will be at 1:30 p.m. in Margaret Rummel's home, 219 Agnes Ave.

Gercken said one of the books he will discuss, "Ninety-Two in the Shade," was written by Thomas McGuane, who divides his time between <a href="Key West">Key West</a>, <a href="Fla.">Fla.</a>, and a 40-acre ranch south of <a href="Livingston">Livingston</a>, <a href="Monta">Mont</a>. McGuane wrote the book in Montana, and it deals with contemporary life in Key West.

Besides "Ninety-Two in the Shade," Gercken also will discuss two classics-"Jane Eyre" by Charlotte Bronte and "Wuthering Heights" by Emily Bronte.
