Central Board Minutes
October 2, 1952

The first Central Board meeting of the year was called to order by our president, Danny Lambros; and minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved. Brennan moved that we approve the recommendation from Budget and Finance Committee that Community Concert tickets for the 1952 - 53 season be priced at \$2.50 for all ASU students. Leuthold seconded. Cameron reported that about 700 tickets would have to be sold at this rate, and the suggestion was made that next year the price be set at \$3.00 instead. The motion was then carried.

Cameron moved that the contract with Henry Busse to play for a dance Friday, Oct. 6, be approved and that we charge \$2.50 per couple and \$1.25 apiece. The motion was seconded, and after some discussion approved -- despite some comments in favor of \$2.75 per couple instead. During the discussion it was pointed out that we plan to pay \$800 during the intermission of the four-hour dance and that the sale of 400 couple tickets would be necessary to break even. The Central Board members declared that they were against reduced rates for high school students. It was pointed out that Harry Burnell is the student chairman of the publicity for this project, and he is not necessarily replacing Walter O'Donnell as co-chairman of the Outside Entertainment Committee.

Brennan reported on plans for organizing the social calendar, stating that groups had been asked to turn in preferred dates for their social functions by the next Tuesday morning, that her committee would meet Tuesday afternoon and evening, and that representatives of all groups would meet Wednesday. She also reported that ASMSU had made \$20 profit on its two dances. The first one resulted in a loss of \$30, but the second one resulted in a gain of \$50.

It was reported that the following committee members can't continue: Mary Ann Dincock of the Social Committee, Buzz Jones of the Publicity-Travel Committee, and Barbara Hill of the Budget and Finance Committee. Leuthold moved that Keith Yerrill be added to the Budget and Finance Committee. Newlin seconded. Motion carried. The other committee heads were asked to submit names of other desired members at the next meeting.

Newlin was appointed to head the fresh election; and the primary was scheduled for Wednesday, Oct. 15. Needs for publicity for four days before and for at least the necessary 20 signatures on petitions were stressed.

A letter from Andy Cogswell was read concerning a request from the World Broadcasting System for the right to transcribe the song "Fight Montana." They would offer 2¢ for each record sold or \$10. The question of what kind of right was raised, and Central Board decided to postpone action until Briggs can look into the matter.

It was reported that a surplus of M Books are in the ASMSU office. It was suggested that they be distributed to freshmen who don't have them during the freshman election.

Wunderlich moved that a letter of congratulations be sent to the Sentinel editor. The motion was seconded and carried.

It was decided that Central Board will meet this quarter on Thursdays at 4:10. Lambros asked that any member who can't attend a meeting notify him ahead of time. The question of how to get better attendance by members and others was raised, but no definite action was decided upon. The suggestion was made that an agenda book be set up in the ASMSU office so that the Kainin could more easily find out what business would come up at the next meeting and publicize this. Being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
