Central Board Minutes
November 20, 1952

The meeting was called to order by Danny Lambros, and minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved.

Leuthold moved that the men's intramural board be enlarged from three members to five, Brennan seconded, and the motion was carried. It was suggested that the ASMSU president try to select one independent and four fraternity men each year and that such offices rotate from house to house.

It was reported that Gripe Board is in favor of taking over the students' activities guidance project discussed previously in Central Board and is looking into the matter. The possibility of changing the name of Gripe Board was considered; and it was pointed out that the official name of this board, according to Article XI of the Constitutional By-Laws is "The Student Ideas for University Betterment Committee."

Henne reported that about 75 freshmen had attended the rally committee meeting and that they are really moving ahead with organization and enthusiasm.

Brennan said that the Social Committee needed suggestions for projects on which to work. The only suggestion made involved the need for help in advertising of Les Brown. Lambros said that a number of other bands and entertainers have offered to perform at ASMSU, but prices have been too high for what can be afforded. For example, there was an offer of a three-hour concert by Paul Whiteman for \$3,500.

Jones moved that Central Board sanction sales of Christmas cards by SCA on the campus, Leuthold seconded, motion carried.

In answer to a question concerning the development of the Constitutional Revision Committee, Lambros reported that he had appointed a committee consisting of Tom Van Meter, Larry Gaughan, Pat Eyer, and Jim Ford to look into the matter and decide on the size and operation of a future committee.

Being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
