MISSOULA--

Judy Janet Foss, a recent graduate of Missoula Sentinel High School and the winner of the first \$100 University of Montana School of Fine Arts Award for Excellence in Music, will enroll at UM to study music composition this fall.

Miss Foss, who will be 18 in August, won the award for her violin playing and composition abilities in competition with two other local high school students, Barbara Koostra and Sharon Peterson. The three students have been members of the Missoula High School Orchestra.

Commenting on college, Miss Foss said, "I plan to study music composition at the University in Missoula one or two years and then transfer to Wheaton College in Illinois, where I probably will major in psychology, although things could very well change before then."

Miss Foss, who is daughter of the Rev. and Mrs. Norman P. Foss, 345 Strand Ave., Missoula, is a native of Princeton, Minn. The Foss family lived in Glendive, Mont., for five years before moving to Missoula eight years ago. Rev. Foss was pastor of the Christian and Missionary Alliance Church in Glendive, and he now holds that position at the CMA Church in Missoula.

Robert Kiley, dean of the UM School of Fine Arts, recently presented the SFA Award to Miss Foss.
