Central Board Minutes
May 31, 1951

The meeting was called to order by Bill Reynolds. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Social Committee report: Olson said that ASMSU is planning to sponsor three mixers during Orientation Week next fall.

Reynolds attended the Pacific Students Presidents Association's convention in Salt Lake. Some of the ideas presented there were:

- (1) To help avert poor convocation attendance some schools close the union.
- (2) Some schools exchange talent which solves the problem of a lack of poor convocations.
- (3) To secure regular Central Board attendance the voting power can be limited to those missing two meetings.
- (4) A score box in the paper for controversial questions.
- (5) Bonding Business managers.
- (6) Perhaps there should be an investment of reserve funds.

At this convention there was also a discussion about a dance band circuit. It was felt that money could be saved if there were one contract between schools.

Reynolds brought up a discussion about N.S.A. He read a letter from Jo Long, North West President, stating the happenings at the N.S.A. conventions. The idea was presented that ASMSU not send a delegate to National convention this year, but send one to the Regional convention. It was the general consensus that material covered at National could be gotten there. Action to join NSA will be reserved until next year.

Schleiman gave a report on Recommendation and Explanations of the Budget and Finance Committee for ('51-'52). Coppedge moved that this report be approved. Kugler seconded. Carried.

A discussion of the election of temporary Freshmen class officers during Orientation Week was brought up. Olson moved that we do away with temporary class officers with the exception of a temporary president, who would represent the Freshmen class and attend Central Board meetings until permanent officers are elected. It is recommended that he attend these meetings.

Reynolds gave an explanation of the meeting of Freshmen during Orientation week. It was decided to have a pep band and cheerleaders at this meeting.

Reynolds announced a Central Board meeting Monday, September 24, at 3:00. The purpose of this meeting is to go through the Orientation Week program.

Schleiman read The Associated Students General Fund Budget ('51-'52). Kugler moved that Central Board accept the allocations read. Nelson seconded. Carried.

Olson (Social Committee) suggested that the Friday night mixer sponsorship be dropped. ASMSU will sponsor a dance Monday night. Friday night could be open to another organization.

Schleiman reported that the Budget and Finance Committee recommended that Central Board not appropriate the money for awards for AcCapella choir seniors. It was felt that approving their proposal would encourage other organizations to come to Central Board for Funds. After some discussion, Nelson moved that Central Board allocate not more than \$25 a year for awards for AcCapella choir seniors, for reasons: 1. The choir has no method of raising the necessary funds. 2. The choir represents the University broadly. The motion was not carried.

There were 134 applications to ASMSU committees. McMasters moved that we accept the ASMSU committees and Standing Committees of the faculty as read by Reynolds. The committees are as follows:
