Central Board Minutes
Special Meeting
Wednesday, Oct. 10, 1951

Bill

The meeting was called to order by Bill Reynolds. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Lucas reported that the display cards order had been misunderstood, in that a minimum order must be of just one color combination, rather than of several combinations. The cost per hundred cards has been raised to \$4.75. Discussion followed. Further action will be taken next week.

Schlieman moved that the matter of ticket price be removed from the table. Jones seconded. The motion was carried. Schlieman moved that a 25¢ admission charge to MSU drama productions for the year '51-'52 be approved by Central Board as recommended by Budget and Finance. Nelson seconded. The motion carried.

Reynolds introduced discussion concerning the possibilities of having a name band here. Hoffman outlined possible offers and dates of offers. Discussion followed. It was decided that Ray Anthony could be employed for October 31. Schlieman moved that Ray Anthony be offered \$12.50.00 minimum and \$1500.00 maximum, for a two-hour concert and two-hour dance October 31. Coppedge seconded. After further discussion, the motion was withdrawn. McMasters moved that Ray Anthony be offered \$1250.00 or 80% of total receipts after tax deduction, for a two-hour concert and two-hour dance October 31. Jones seconded. The motion carried. Schlieman moved that Ray Anthony be offered \$1500.00 maximum, providing previous offers be refused. Coppedge seconded. The motion carried. Two dissenting.

Schlieman moved that \$1.80 be charged for tickets for admission to concert and dance. Nelson seconded. The motion carried.

Reynolds announced that the High School Horizon Club has asked Central Board to approve their selling pom-poms at the Homecoming game. Discussion followed. Because it seems that some University organization should enjoy any profits, Olson moved that Central Board grant permission to the High School Horizon Club to sell pom-poms at the Homecoming Game only if no University Organization offers to take over the sale by 9:00 p.m. Thursday, October 11. Schlieman seconded. The motion carried.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
