Central Board Minutes
Monday, October 15, 1951

The meeting was called to order by Bill Reynolds. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as corrected.

Budget and Finance committee submitted the following recommendation for approval from Central Board:

Modification of Associated Students Budget 1951-1952, Paragraph V.
Dramatics to read: That the Dramatics Department pay half (\$192.50) of the \$385.00 owed, immediately upon receipt of Student Activity Fee for the autumn quarter with the remainder to be paid as later designated.

Discussion followed. Schlieman moved that Central Board accept above recommendation. Jones seconded.. Motion carried.

Olson reported that Ray Anthony has tentatively accepted an offer of \$1500.00 or 80% of the gate receipts after tax deduction. The contract has not been signed. Discussion followed. Acceptance of the offer is contingent upon transportation for the band from Boise to Missoula. Schlieman moved that Central Board accept and approve the offer of \$1500.00 or 80% of net receipts, which ever is the larger. Olson seconded. Motion carried.

Lucas reported that M.S.C. has rejected plan of buying half the order of show cards, and that other schools in this vicinity are being contacted on the matter. No further action will be taken until Central Board hear a recommendation from traditions board.

Reynolds reported that Spurs and Bear paws will start train ticket sales today, and suggested that tickets sell for \$6.25 rather than \$6.21 to facilitate making change and to cover any expense. Schlieman moved that Central Board approve \$6.25 per round trip ticket to Bozeman for the game. This motion modifies motion of October 8. Coppedge seconded. Motion carried. Discussion followed concerning train schedule. Olson moved that Central Board request that train leave Missoula at 6:30 a.m. Saturday and return from Bozeman at 1:00 a.m. Sunday. Kugler seconded. Motion carried.

Reynolds suggested that Central Board approve rates for individual community concert tickets in proportion to increased series ticket price. Discussion followed. Schlieman moved that Central Board approve \$1.00 ticket price for the first and last concerts, and \$.75 for the second and third concerts. McMasters seconded. Motion carried.

Jones moved that Central Board accept and validate petitions for election. Olson seconded. Motion carried. Schlieman moved that Central Board certify petition to freshman offices and Sophomore president, subject to checking of signatures by election committee. A special Central Board meeting will be tentatively scheduled to discuss any discrepancies. Coppedge seconded. Motion carried. Briggs pointed out that Central Board can interpret the constitution in one of three ways regarding Freshman eligibility for vote in ASMSU elections: (1) the class is not permanently organized and is therefore unable to vote (2) Class will be able to vote in ASMSU elections after fall quarter (3) Freshman can vote in ASMSU election fall quarter. Schlieman moved that Freshmen be regarded as ineligible for vote in ASMSU election. Coppedge seconded. Motion carried. Olson moved that primary election be Wednesday, October 17, from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. in the Bitterroot room, and that the final election take place Oct. 24 at the same place and at the same time. Schlieman seconded. Motion carried.

Jones moved that Central Board accept following recommendation from publication board: Cyrus Noe as Mountaineer editor and Marilyn Matson as Mountaineer Business Manager for the ensuing year. Olson seconded. Motion carried. Olson moved that Bill Jones be accepted as Associate editor to the Kaimen. Coppedge seconded. Motion carried. Schlieman moved that Bob Lindborg be given authority to disburse photographer's salary to his own discretion. Coppedge seconded. Motion carried.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
