Central Board Minutes
Monday, Oct. 29, 1951

The meeting was called to order by Bill Reynolds. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The new secretary, Donna Persons, and the new Freshman Central Board delegate, Bob Newlin, were installed in office by Reynolds.

Olson reported that sales for Ray Anthony were not too good. The committee had checked on further publicity for the dance in the smaller towns around Missoula, but it was to no avail. About 400 tickets have been sold so far in the Coke Store.

Reynolds announced that we would need about 650 pounds of ~~buff~~ buffalo meat for Aber Day, and we have been offered a half a buffalo which would only amount to about 300 pounds.

Under old business, Reynolds brought up the situation of freshmen voting in an election in case of a vacancy of an ASMSU office. He appointed Schlieman and Newlin, a committee of two to draw up a by-law to the constitution. There are two alternatives left:

- 1) the freshmen can vote in the case of such an election after they are organized, or
- 2) the freshmen cannot vote should such an election arise.

Vince Wilson, Physical Therapist and Ass't Prof. of Health and Physical Ed. made a request that Central Board delay action on a campus chest drive for a week. He stated that he "is not opposed to voluntary cooperative action in fund raising for welfare work, so long as freedom of action is guaranteed to the participating agencies and to those who support those agencies with their money and so long as no kind of coercion is practiced against agencies which do not participate in federated fund raising or against individual contributors as to impair their right to select specific welfare activities for their support." He went on to say that he was sure that the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis will still consider scholarship applicants from MSU even if a compulsory federated fund drive is established but he was sure that sufficient money would not be available for scholarships or the care of students who might be the victims of polio if all campuses and all communities adopted compulsory federated drives. A discussion followed where it was brought up that students do not have the funds available to donate to all the drives and one chest drive would benefit more in the long run. Central Board members agreed to delay action for a week and Wholgent said he would publicize both sides of the issue in the Kainin.

Kugler moved that Central Board meetings be changed from Monday to Wednesday at 4 p.m., due to a conflict in classes. McMaster seconded. Motion carried.

Reynolds brought up the question of who gets complimentary tickets to Ray Anthony. A discussion followed and it was decided that there would be no complimentary tickets given away formally, but it would be left up to the discretion of the social chairman and Budget and Finance.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
