Michael M. McCarthy, Missoula, a University of Montana student who is president of the Western Montana Epilepsy Association (WMEA), said the group still needs about \$200 to become affiliated officially with the Epilepsy Foundation of America.

McCarthy said the national organization provides brochures and education programs for local epilepsy groups and advisory assistance for families affected by epilepsy and for teachers and religious groups.

The WMEA, organized a year ago to serve all communities in western Montana, has been involved recently in collecting recyclable aluminum beer and pop cans, newspapers, bottles and other material to raise funds to operate the WMEA office, room 210 at St. Patrick Hospital.
