ANNUAL COMPETITION FOR FULBRIGHT-HAYS OVERSEAS STUDY TO CLOSE SOON

MISSOULA--

An informational meeting at the University of Montana for graduate students and graduating seniors interested in study abroad under grants provided by the Mutual at Educational Exchange Program (Fulbright-Hays) will be held/noon Friday, Oct. 4, in room 337 of the Liberal Arts Building.

Application forms and information on the program may be obtained from UM campus
Fulbright program adviser, Joan Birch, who is located in room 215 of Turner Hall. Deadline
for filing applications is Monday, Oct. 21.

Most of the grants offered provide round-trip transportation, tuition and maintenance for one academic year. A few provide only international travel or a stipend intended as a partial grant-in-aid.

Candidates must be U.S. citizens at the time of application, hold a bachelor's degree or its equivalent by the beginning date of the grant, have language ability commensurate with the demands of the proposed study projects and be in good health. Preference is given to those between the ages of 20 and 35.

Positions are available in Latin America, Africa, Asia, Australia and Europe, with 150 of the total 550 being filled in Germany.
