MISSOULA--

Dr. Florence Reynolds, a professor of music at the University of Montana in Missoula, will present a violoncello recital at 8 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 20, in the UM Music Recital Hall.

The program, with Rudolph Wendt, professor emeritus of music at UM, as piano accompanist, will be open to the public without charge under the sponsorship of the UM School of Fine Arts and Department of Music.

Works on the program will include "Sonata Op. 102, No. 2" by Beethoven, "Sonate Op. 8" by Kodaly and "Second Sonata, in C" by Ross Lee Finney.

Reynolds, who joined the UM faculty in 1953, holds bachelor and master's degrees and a doctor of musical arts degree from the Eastman School of Music (ESM), Rochester, N.Y. She has toured the northwest with the Montana String Quartet from UM, and the Storioni Trio, and has been active as a string clinician and adjudicator in Montana and neighboring states. She has concertized in various parts of the U.S. and Europe.

Wendt joined the UM music faculty in 1939 and retired last spring. His teaching specialties included piano, piano ensemble and keyboard harmony. Wendt received his bachelor and master's degrees in music at ESM and he did doctoral work at ESM and the Juilliard School of Music, New York, N.Y.

Reynolds also has studied at Juilliard.
