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Documents from the October 3, 1950 meeting of the Associated Students of the University of Montana (ASUM)

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The meeting was called to order by Bob Anderson and the minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Murphy read the recommendation of Budget and Finance that

- 1) Central Board approve the play of Hinze
- 2) That season tickets to the Community Concert be sold for \$21.00, and that individual tickets be priced as follows: Odnoposoff, 75¢; Balle Russe, 75¢; Nan Merman, 75¢; Whitman & Lowell, \$1.00.

He said that the reasons for the requested increase in prices were due to decreased student enrollment and to expenses exceeding income. Murphy then moved that the above recommendations be approved by Central Board. Kugler seconded the motion. Carried.

McKown presented Publications Board's recommendations that Central Board approve Skulason Moe as the 1950-51 Sentinel photographer, and that they approve Pub. Board's statement of policy. McKown then moved that the above recommendations be approved. McMasters seconded. Carried.

Monroe DeJarnette was present to ask about our outside entertainment set-up. Anderson referred him to the Public Exercise and the Social Committee.

Mr. Briggs asked that notice be taken of the fact that the action taken Sept. 20, 1950 by Central Board of passing a by-law in reference to the filling of vacancies in elective committees was void as far as Store Board was concerned since it remains within the sole powers of Store Board to fill vacancies in elective offices where they are concerned. Murphy then moved that the by-law enacted last week be repealed. Briggs seconded. Carried.

Wunderlich reported that the Budget and Policy committee of the faculty has not yet approved the traffic control proposal made last year by the students.

Burton Robertson requested that Kappa Tau be given permission to put out a student directory containing names, addresses, and phone numbers which would be sold on campus. Anderson asked that he take his request to Publications Board before Central Board take action upon the request.

Anderson submitted for approval by Central Board the following appointments to committees.

Traditions Board--Betty Ann Halleck

Outside Entertainment Committee--Monroe DeJarnette, George Kraus, Virginia Rowe

Kind moved that the above appointees be accepted. Wunderlich seconded. Carried.

Anderson also submitted the names of the alumni representatives to Central Board and to Athletic Board as recommended by the Alumni Association. They are:

Central Board---Marion Smith Boone

Athletic Board--B.G. Paige and Andy Cogswell

It was suggested that action on these alumni appointments be delayed until a letter to the President of the Alumni Association could be sent pointing out the desirability of having an appointee to Central Board who is able to be present at all or most of the meetings.

Wunderlich suggested that class offices be defined more clearly to those both in and running for these offices. He also recommended that an agenda of Central Board's meetings be posted on the Student Union Bulletin Board previous to their meetings. Anderson said that he would post such an agenda.

CENTRAL BOARD (Con't)

Anderson announced that there will be election of permanent freshman class officers on Thursday, Oct. 19 (primary), and that the final election will be held on Thursday, Oct. 26. Election will also be held at those times for the senior delegate to Central Board. Petitions for all offices must be in the Student Union business office by Saturday noon, October 14. McMasters will be in charge of the elections.

Murphy moved that Division I, Article V, sentence 2 of the by-laws be altered so that it will read as follows:

....Nomination will be made from the floor and voting will be by secret ballot, the person receiving the largest number of votes to duly fill the vacancy, provided that at least 20 per cent of the members of the association or class affected vote, or, at the discretion of Central Board, an election patterned after the regular ASMSU elections be held.

McMasters seconded the motion and the motion carried.

The meeting was then adjourned.
