The University of Montana women's volleyball team takes a 2-8-1 match record to Spokane this weekend for the Eastern Area Tournament. Coach Cheryl Lyman said her team is progressing and that it has been gearing up for this meet.

Lyman believes the team to beat is Washington State University. She said "the Eastern area tournament should be a big one for us if we can beat WSU."
