MISSOULA--

A 40-minute color film and 20-minute panel discussion on the Warm Springs State Hospital and the Boulder River School and Hospital will be broadcast Saturday, Jan. 25, on KGVO-KTVM television.

The film, entitled, "Us and Them: Mental Health Care in Montana," is part of a project sponsored by the Montana Association of Churches under a grant from the Montana Committee for the Humanities (MCH), which is headquartered at the University of Montana in Missoula. Dr. Margaret Kingsland, who has offices at UM, is MCH director.

The film, to be broadcast in Missoula, Butte and Bozeman at 10 p.m. Saturday, will attempt to give the public a visual image of conditions at the two hospitals, to raise some of the legal and ethical questions involved and to suggest possible alternatives to the current system. Its overall intention is to create dialogue on mental health and a comprehensive mental health care system in the state which will affirm the dignity of all the participants.

Panel participants are: Ed Kellner, Helena, director of the State Department of Institutions; Dick Rosenlief, assistant director of Social and Rehabilitative Services at Warm Springs; Ms. Jan Frisch, director of Social and Behavioral Services at Boulder, and Howard Schwartz, Missoula, political theorist.

Commenting on the film presentation, Kingsland said, "The MCH considers this project one of the most significant grants made this year and is pleased by the quality of the discussions it has generated."
