1,467 STUDENTS ON HONOR ROLL
FOR 1974 FALL QUARTER AT UM

MISSOULA--

Names of 1,467 students at the University of Montana in Missoula are listed on the 1974 fall quarter honor roll, recently released by the office of Philip T. Bain, director of UM Admissions and Records .

The total number of University students on the honor roll represents 17.1 percent of the fall quarter net enrollment of 8,566, effective following the fifth week of fall quarter classes. Of the 1,467 who gained honor roll status fall quarter, a total of 342, or 23.2 percent, received straight A's.

The honor roll is computed on a 4.0 or straight-A basis. To be eligible for honor roll status, a student must have either a minimum of 54 grade points with an index of 3.0 or B average, or a minimum of 42 grade points with an index of 3.5, or B-plus. No student is eligible for the honor roll if he receives an F grade for the quarter.

The list of UM honor roll students was prepared by Bain's office and the UM Computer Center.
