DORIAN CONGER PRESENTS REPORT ON RESEARCH
AT HONORS CONFERENCE AT DEPAUW UNIVERSITY

MISSOULA--

Dorian S. Conger, a junior in interpersonal communications at the University of Montana in Missoula, presented a report on his original research at DePauw University's first undergraduate honors conference in Greencastle, Ind., March 20-22. He presented a paper entitled "A Combined Approach to Organizational Communication from an Interpersonal Perspective."

Papers, chosen competitively, were presented at DePauw by 28 collegians from 22 U.S. universities. Theme of the three-day meeting was "The Communications Arts and Sciences: An Integrative Approach."

Conger, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ray Conger, 140 Arrowhead Drive, Missoula, is a June 1972 graduate of Missoula Sentinel High School.

Joint sponsors of the undergraduate honors conference were DePauw and the International Communication Association.
